COLFAX, Nov. 9.—(AP)—Twisted and torn cars of the Southern Pacific's westbound Challenger, which was derailed on a mountain curve three miles west of here, killing at least nine and injuring 79 are being cleared away by wrecking crews today as investigators sought the cause of the accident.

The train, heavily laden with passengers, was en route from Chicago to San Francisco.

The Navy announced names of naval personnel dead and injured in the wreck. None was from the Pacific Northwest.

WAR CASUALTIES NAVY REVEALS 300 CASUALTIES


The Navy Department today announced 300 casualties for the Navy, Mr. E. R. Basye, and Coast Guard, including 38 dead, 251 wounded and 10 missing, the Associated Press reported. Three were from Washington State.

Today's list brought the total for the three departments to 71,839, with 28,599 dead; 29,442 wounded, 9,311 missing and 4,487 prisoners of war. Aggregate figures for the three departments are: Navy—Total, 38,039, with 18,460 dead, 8,784 wounded, 8,253 missing and 2,542 prisoners of war.

Seattle Youth Lost Life On Jap Prison Ship

Pfc. Francis E. Noland, for two and a half years a prisoner of war of the Japs, was among men missing from a group of American war prisoners who were on board a Japanese freighter sunk recently off the Philippines, the War Department has notified his mother, Mrs. E. R. Basye, 921 First Ave. W.



"That's about all I can stand," Mrs. Basye said tearfully today, "to have him suffer for so long and then have him lost on that ship. Why, I heard from another woman whose son was among the rescued, that our boys were packed in that death ship like sardines and the portholes and hatches were plugged, giving them practically no air in that awful heat!"

Noland, 24 years old, was an Army Air Force member, stationed at Clark Field in the Philippines when war broke out. Just a year ago, Mrs. Basye received her only word from him—a form post card—saying that he hoped for a quick reunion and to "keep your spirits up."

LIEUT. GRAHAM KILLED IN ITALY

Second Lieut. John B. Graham, 22-year-old Army Air Force bombardier-navigator and winner of the Air Medal in less than a month of duty overseas, was killed in action October 17 over Italy, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Graham, 2133 Shelby St., have been notified by the War Department.



Details of young Graham's death were not revealed, the father said, but in a recent letter he had told of bombing tank concentrations in the vicinity of Vienna in support of Russian forces.

Young Graham's squadron recently had received a presidential citation for its accuracy in its bombing missions, Mr. Graham said. Lieutenant Graham was an only son. He was born in Yakima, coming here with his parents in 1933. He was graduated from Roosevelt High School, where, in his senior year, he played center field on the baseball team.
