### BLUNDER WILL BE CORRECTED

Readjustment of the Jackson Street Regrade Roll to Be Made Through an Ordinance and a Supplemental Tax.

Property owners in the Jackson Street Regrade Improvement district, extending from Fourth Avenue South to Twelfth Avenue South, are to be given protection from an arbitrary assessment made by City Engineer R. H. Thomson through the means of an ordinance to go to the city council Monday night.

Edmond Bowden represented the aggrieved property owners, setting forth that the petition and the ordinance proposed by the city engineer, contained a provision that any property owners who were allowed damages should not be assessed to exceed \$5 a front foot for the regrade.

Comparatively a small portion of the property in the district will be affected by the ordinance, and the assessment roll to make it comply with the provisions of the ordinance.

It should be understood once and for all that the legal department of the city had nothing whatever to do with this assessment roll.

This explanation was brought about by the objection of Councilman Frank P. Mullen that the corporation counsel had directed how the assessment should be spread.
