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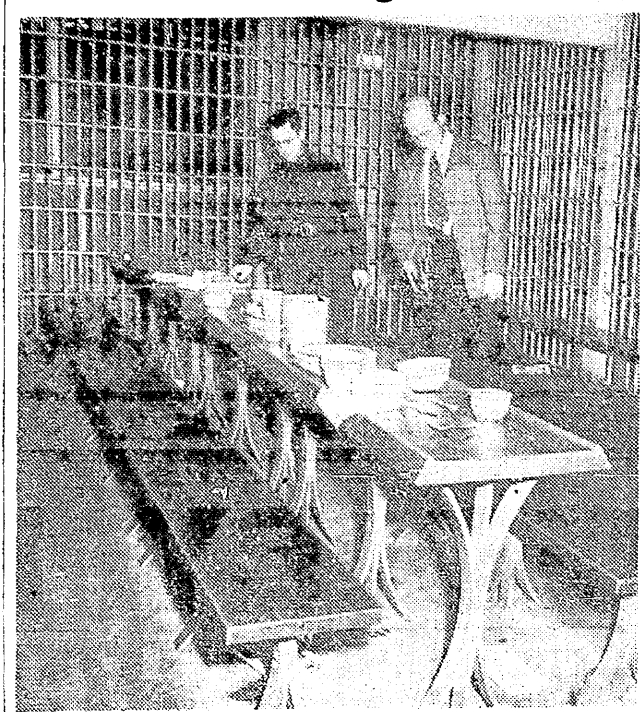
AUTOIST TRIES TO RAM OFFICERS

A 39-year-old hotel bellman, who threatened to run down two policemen with his automobile after he had cursed and struck a Kirkland woman on a downtown street, was arrested about midnight when police advanced on him with drawn pistols.

Police said the man had stopped his automobile beside two women who were disembarking from their machine at Seventh Avenue South and King Street shortly after midnight. According to the police report, he began cursing them. When the women objected, he jumped from his car and struck Dorothy Rudolph in the face with his fist.

His automobile, still in motion, crashed into a parked car. When Patrolmen E. M. Hull and J. W. Bolen arrived and ordered the man to move his automobile, he jumped in and drove to King Street, where the officers caught up with him. He threatened to run them down, they said, but he surrendered when they drew their pistols.

two jail levels containing ten cell blocks, including the juvenile ward. "Sheriff Callahan has a tremendous responsibility in handling these juveniles and I most certainly don't envy him in his job. He has done everything humanly possible to give them the best attention he can, but his facilities are totally unsuited for dealing with delinquents. "Juveniles absolutely should not

have to be placed in the jail but our means of handling them here make it impossible for us to do otherwise. "The youth, hooked as a pipefitter, was found dead in a shower room adjacent to a cell block where seven other youth, all 17 or younger, were being held. "Miller, after questioning Emberg's cell mates, said the 'youth' was slugged first with a shower handle and then beaten. "Youth Often Beaten "Callahan's deputies said the juvenile believed to have administered the beating was a "trouble maker from the word go. "Reiterating his need for more jailers to bolster his understaffed crew, Callahan added: "We had been trying for several days to get rid of this boy who did the beating. He was supposed to have been taken to Chehalis yesterday. We had had trouble with him several times. He had gotten into a fight yesterday afternoon with another juvenile in a different ward. "Callahan said the suspected assailant had been lodged in jail on orders of juvenile authorities twice since December 12. Records showed he had been transferred from the city jail December 12 and released to his mother, a Seattle woman, December 21, and that he had been jailed again December 29. "No Place for Kids' "Callahan said he has 400 prisoners, including city jail prisoners, in the county jail and "it is impossible to keep an adequate watch over the men with the staff I have."

Capt. George W. Kimball, juvenile officer for the Police Department, said Emberg had been arrested by Sgt. A. W. Weber and Pvt. F. G. Kline of the Military Police because he was wearing Army clothes and had papers belonging to a soldier. "Emberg, arrested December 24, was transferred that day to the county jail pending an investigation. He said he had purchased the Army clothes. "The body was found by Jailer J. A. Anderson, on duty on the two deck levels last night. Williams said the fight apparently was in the main cell and the body was dragged to the shower room.

Youth Given 10 Years In Reformatory "Sixteen-year-old Bill McFadden, who pleaded guilty December 19 to a charge of automobile theft, yesterday was sentenced to ten years in the state reformatory at Monroe by Presiding Judge Hugh C. Todd. "The court informed the youth he was being sent to the reformatory on recommendation of the prosecutor's office so he could be given proper treatment for tuberculosis. "George Washington Greer, 17, and Henry Frank Weigel, 19, who pleaded guilty to second-degree burglary, also appeared before Judge Todd for sentencing. "The judge deferred sentencing Greer for two years on condition that he serve three months in the county jail. Weigel was sentenced to 15 years in the reformatory, suspended on condition he serve six months in the county jail.

Neighbors Friendly, Say Returned Japs "PORTLAND, Or., Jan. 17.—(AP)—Three Japanese-Americans, back in the Hood River Valley—local point of much anti-Japanese activity—yesterday reported a "more-than-gracious" welcome from their former-neighbors. "Ray Sato and Sat Noji of Parkdale and Min Asai of Barrett told the War Relocation Authority office here they had started pruning their 40- and 50-acre orchards with friendly encouragement from nearby farmers.

KIMSEY AGAINST DEAL FOR TOWER

Possible purchase by the city of the 42-story Smith Tower—offered at \$900,000—is opposed vigorously by Police Chief Herbert D. Kimsey, it was disclosed today.

"I'd rather have nothing than that building," the chief declared with feeling. "It just couldn't work out for the Police Department."

Mayor William F. Devin had suggested the building could become the postwar home of both the Police and Health Departments. Construction of a new building would cost about \$3,000,000.

Dr. Ragnar T. Westman, acting city health commissioner, conceded that "as far as the Health Department is concerned, I guess we could fit in there all right."

Kimsey has informed the mayor of his strong opposition. "I want something built for a Police Department, not just some building handed us with a 'Here it is, now use it,' the chief said. "I won't go for anything except a new building that will meet our needs—at least, not if I can help it."

Nazis Burned And Pillaged Most of Warsaw

Chicago Daily News Foreign Service WITH THE POLISH ARMY NEAR WARSAW—(Delayed)—(CDN)—Block by block, the city of Warsaw is being razed to the ground as its German occupants mine and burn its buildings one by one after stripping them of all their furnishings. (Warsaw was captured today.)

At night the shivering inhabitants of fuelless Praga can see the fires as the Germans ignite what used to be the homes of many of their relatives.

Central Area in Ruins

The entire central area of the Polish capital, where once 750,000 people lived, now lies in ruins. All civilian survivors of the August rebellion have been removed by the Germans to Puzoskow and other concentration camps in Western Poland. The dead city is now inhabited solely by the ghoulies of the German army.

Praga itself is three-quarters destroyed, but at least 200,000 persons are still living here, oblivious to the danger of falling shells. Not to be outdone by the inhabitants of Praga, my colleague and I passed a comfortable night in a Polish army "hotel" less than half a mile from the German lines.

The next morning the five of us were escorted through the wreckage of Praga's most fashionable residential district, up to the very edge of the river.

The front was quiet. Guarding the Vistula trenches were the members of a Polish regiment formed in Tarnopol. Most of them have relatives in America.

Despite its dangerous position on the very front lines, the people of Praga are doing what they can to reestablish normal life.

Dairy Farmers Warn Union On Boycott

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17.—(AP)—Charles W. Holman, secretary of the National Cooperative Milk Producers' Federation, warned the International Teamsters' Union today that if a boycott against handling milk from the Walker-Goudas Farm, Plainsboro, N. J., is continued, dairy farmers are prepared to fight the union on the issue.

"Organizers and officials of the union are invading fields foreign to their jurisdiction when they assume that they have the right to organize a milkman on a dairy farm," Holman said in a statement.

"Attempts to organize operators of farm machinery—whether they run tractors or milking machines—not only ignore provisions of the National Labor Relations Act and the Fair Labor Standards Act, but can have no other result than to cripple the farmers' war-production efforts."

Officers said the system has had the effect of preventing hoarding, and has worked successfully. The cigarette shortage has been felt at the air station chiefly in a lack of selection of popular brands or more of the most popular brands usually are missing from the shelves.

Silver Star Awarded To Gen. O'Donnell

B-29 (HEADQUARTERS, Guam, Jan. 15.—(Via Navy Radio)—(Delayed)—(AP)—Brig. Gen. Emmett (Rosie) O'Donnell won the Silver Star today for leading 111 Superfortresses over Tokyo in the first raid, November 27, and bringing 109 home.

O'Donnell, commander of a combat unit in the Twenty-First Bomber Command, received the medal from Brig. Gen. Haywood S. Hansell, Jr., commander of the Twenty-First, in a ceremony at a Guam airbase.

His citation disclosed for the first time the size of the first force raiding Tokyo.

Hansell also cited one entire aviation engineering group and its four component units for acting to save planes in raids.

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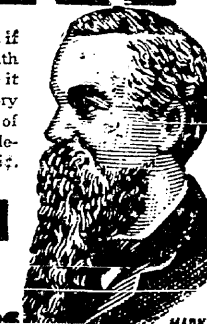
