

GERMAN WOMEN IN HIMMLER GRIP

LONDON, Feb. 12.—(AP)—Every woman and girl in Germany was made liable for auxiliary service with the Volksturm (People's Army) under a decree broadcast by D. N. B., thus bringing the entire German nation within the grip of Gestapo Chief Heinrich Himmler, commander of the home army.
