Condemnation of the anti-Japanese meeting held in Bellevue Monday night has been expressed in a resolution signed by eight members of the East Side Ministerial Asso-

ciation, the Rev. Robert B. Shaw of Bothell announced today.

un-American and un-Christian attitude of the self-appointed leaders

of that meeting, who proposed the ejection of all American citizens of Japanese descent from this country," the resolution stated. "The proposed action is so obviously contrary to the spirit and letter of the Constitution that all good citizens of our nation should join in opposing this Fascist-Nazi philosophy and action. discrimination which we have

"It is an expression of racial strongly condemned in other coun-

tries and which must be elimi-nated speedily if a world organization for peace is to have a chance. "We believe that our sons have fought and died for justice,

equality and peace throughout the world, and it is unthinkable that we at home should be false to

these ideals for which they have been asked to pay so high a price."
