HOW TWO O. P. A. BILLS COMPARE

WASHINGTON, July 13.—(AP)—The Office of Price Administration bill passed early today by the Senate stacks up this way against the extension legislation President Truman vetoed June 29:

1. Provisions in the new bill, not contained in the old, would: Exempt from price controls livestock, meat, poultry, eggs, milk, butter and dairy products; cottonseed, soybeans and their products; grain and livestock or poultry feed made from it; tobacco and its products.

FROWNS GREET NEW O. P. A. BILL

WASHINGTON, July 13.—(AP)—The Senate passed, 62 to 15, early today an Office of Price Administration revival bill that had been denuded of almost as many major price controls as it promised to restore.

Final passage came at 1:56 a. m., on the thirteenth day of O. P. A.'s lapse into a legal coma. Approval was obvious almost from the moment that the roll call of weary senators began, six minutes earlier.

Truman Disapproval Seen—Apparently amended far beyond the bounds which would permit its acceptance by President Truman, the one-year extension measure was sent to the House, where it seemed likely to receive a quick passage toward a Senate-House conference committee.

Japanese Lose Citizenship Case

SAN FRANCISCO, July 13.—(AP)—Federal Judge A. F. St. Sure has dismissed an action through which Americans sought restoration of the U. S. citizenship they renounced after Pearl Harbor.

80 in Cairo Held In Probe of Reds

CAIRO, July 13.—(AP)—Police today announced the arrest of about 80 persons, including the son of a Jewish banker of Italian origin, in an investigation of the Egyptian Communist movement.

China Fleet At Tokyo Bitter Pill to Japs

TOKYO, July 13.—(AP)—A bitter pill was swallowed by the Japanese today as the bulk of the Chinese fleet—eight warships—was reviewed by two Chinese generals in Tokyo Bay—where the Japanese once swore no Chinese craft would anchor.

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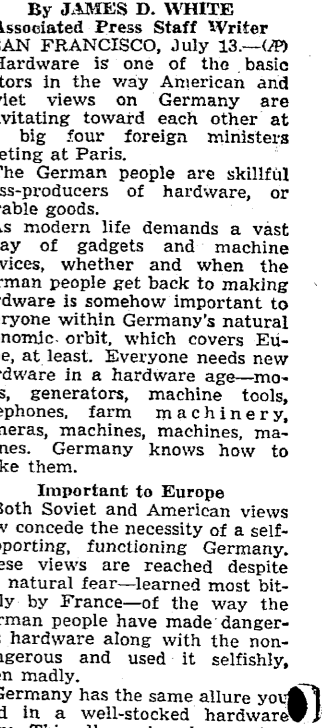
