In a plea for unity among the 20 nations drafting a hemisphere defense agreement, Marshall said New World unity is "vastly important" to the future of the Old World.
"The results of our labors

demonstrate to all the world that peoples, and nations, who really want peace can have peace by liv-ing in an atmosphere of increasing cooperative action and good will," Marshall said. Responding to proposals for
