Failing to find her, Mrs. McNeese telephoned her husband, who notified Sheriff Harlan Callahan's office. Suzanne crawled out from under the cot half an hour later while Mrs. McNeese was showing Sheriff's Deputy Howard Rutan a picture of her. Mrs. McNeese said both Suzie and her sister, Cynthia, 3, “run true to form at nap time.” That could mean that tucking them in their cribs could be like stuffing a two-pound live crab in a one-pound lard bucket.

Notes 'Planted' by F. B. I. Reported Found on Miss Coplon

By Associated Press. WASHINGTON, April 28.—Handwritten notes from a “planted” F. B. I. report were found in Judith Coplon's purse when she was arrested, a government prosecutor said today.

Miss Coplon, former employee of the Department of Justice, was arrested March 4 in the company of Valentine A. Gubitchev, a Russian citizen since suspended from a job with the United Nations. In addition to the separate espionage case against Miss Coplon here, she and the Russian have been indicted in New York on espionage-conspiracy charges. Raymond P. Whearty, an assistant attorney-general, told the jury that she had been shown the F. B. I. report on the day of her arrest. Archibald Palmer, attorney for Miss Coplon, in his own opening statement to the jury, called the fake report “an outrageous attempt to trap” his client. He said the material she carried was either in connection with her work for use in connection with a civil service examination, or in furtherance of her ambitions to write. “Love knows no bounds,”

Mills, 57, St. Charles, Ill. Mrs. Sharkley suffered scalp lacerations which were closed by four stitches. Dan Seibert, trainmaster, said the derailment apparently was caused by the breaking of a journal box in the first unit of a twin dining car.

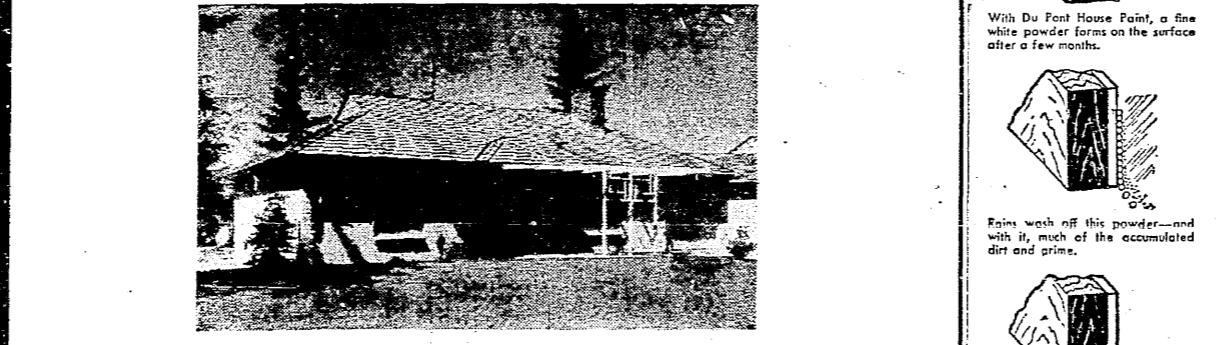
