L. A. to Get Ancient Roman Marble

ROME, Oct. 7.—(AP)—A three-ton block of marble from the ancient Roman Colosseum will be sent next week to the people of Los Angeles. Formal presentation of the block—a gift of the Italian government and the citizens of Rome—was made last April to United States Ambassador James C. Dunn. It will be delivered to the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum Commission for placement in the modern Coliseum. Rome may advertise widely in the United States to get its share of tourist money.

Polio Estimate Up To Record 41,000

NEW YORK, Oct. 7.—(AP)—The 1949 total of poliomyelitis cases in this country is expected to reach 41,000 by the end of the year. The previous epidemic record was in 1916, when about 30,000 persons were stricken.

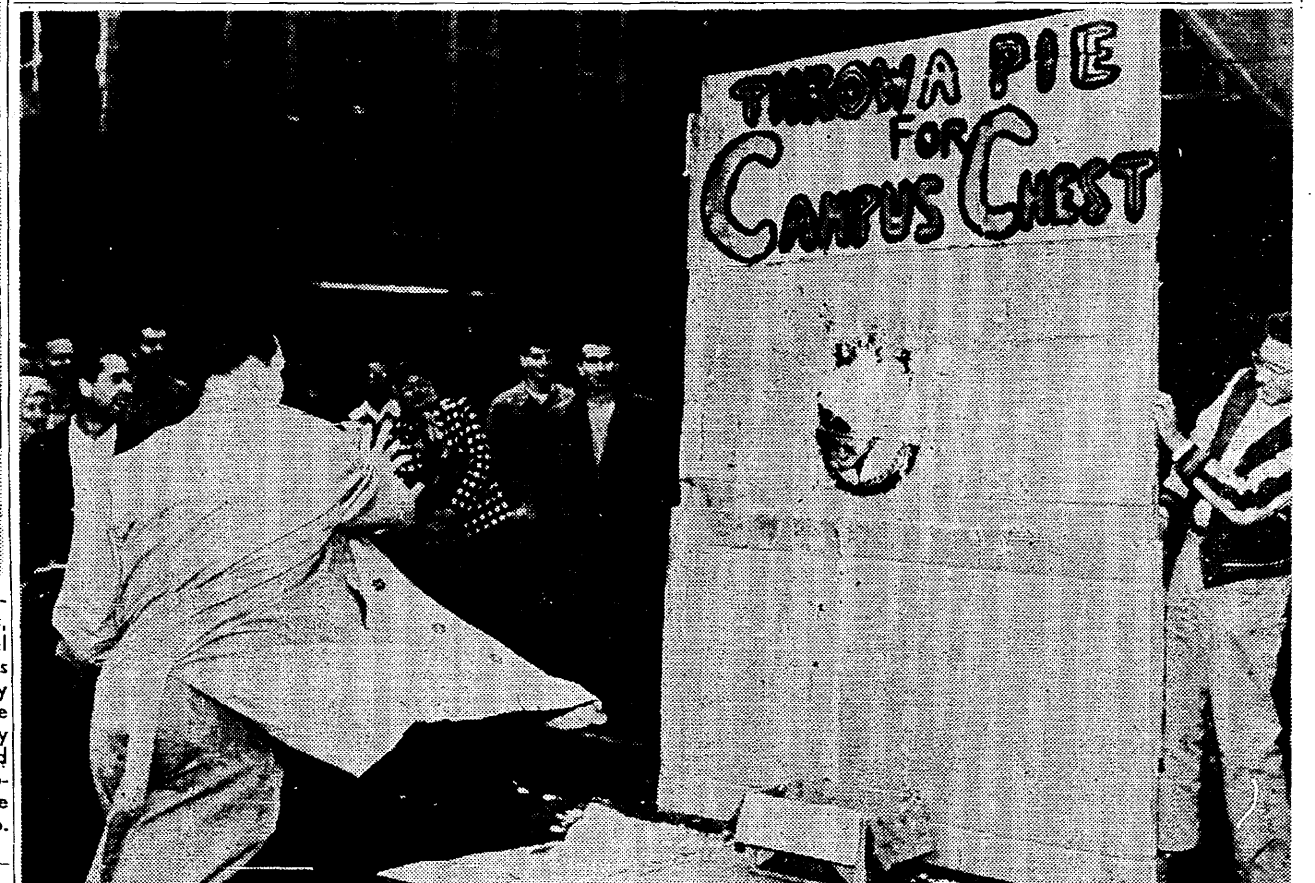
Studio Club Meets Monday
