ROOT EXPLAINS ABOUT JAPANESE AGREEMENT

WASHINGTON, Thursday, Dec. Unsectury of State Ellin 1904, before the Senate committee on foreign relations, today pointed our that the only obligation men either party to the chitente between the Ended States and Japan relating to the maintenance of China's integrity is that they shall consult with each other before indeptaking any action concerning thimese infarrs, and therefore the agreement does not assume the character of a treaty. If no action is taken by the committee the whole natter will remain as negotiated by the secretary of state.
