NEW YORK Thursday, April 28—Census enumerators anxious to list every homeless and temporary resident as a citizen of New York, swooped down on the bench loungers. In thirty city parks at midnight, but accomplished little. Comparatively few names were added to the list, despite the thoroughness of the canvass.
