KELOGG'S BILLS GO BACK TO COMMITTEE

Proposed Ordinances Designed to Block Electrification of Any Part of Madison Street Cable to Be Reconsidered.

REVELLE LEADS FIGHT ON THREE MEASURES

Declares That Selfishness of Big Property Owners Inspires Opposition to Change in System—Garbage Bond Sale.

Following a bitter fight in the city council which Councilman Thomas P. Revelle, William H. Weaver, James Schumpert, and James Schumpert were the principal participants, three bills introduced by Kellogg for the express purpose of preventing the electrification of any part of the Madison Street cable road, were referred back to the corporations committee for one week, and will be considered Friday afternoon.

In opposing the bills, Revelle, who is chairman of the corporations committee, and who has been the champion of the committee for their passage, spoke at considerable length on the selfishness displayed by property owners along Madison Street, mentioning the Puget Mill Company, Cyrus Walker, and Thomas Burke, who are opposed to the passage of any of the bills.

KELOGG DEFENDS BILLS

In support of his bills Kellogg made it plain that they were intended to insure to the people along Madison Street the same rights as they possess without interruption and without the necessity of transferring.

Schumpert said that he wanted to go on record as opposing the three bills which he promised to vote for when it came to final passage, whether it was by a majority or by a vote of the council.

Councilman J. M. Wolfe said that he was not ready to vote on the bills and favored sending them to the committee for a week.
