FATAL TO ZIONITE

Religious Fanaticism Fails to Cure Oliver Pugh, One of Most Prominent Followers of Alexander Dowie.

SUFFERS ALMOST WEEK FROM SERPENT'S STING

Bitten Last Wednesday, Remained True to Teachings of Creed and Refused Antidotes and Medicine.

CHICAGO, Tuesday, June 14.—Death, caused by a rattlesnake bite, last night ended almost a week of torture endured, through religious fanaticism by Oliver Pugh, 60 years old, of Zion City.

Pugh was bitten by the snake last Wednesday, but, true to the teachings of his creed, refused to take antidotes for the poison or medicine of any kind, relying on the prayers of his fellow religionists to cure him.

Pugh was bitten on the little finger while picking strawberries. He was a former alderman of Zion City, going to Zion in the days of John Alexander Dowie.

Pugh is the most prominent Zionite to die in tortures without medical attendance since Dowie's daughter succumbed some years ago to burns she sustained while using a curling iron, used to heat a curling iron, exploded.

GLADYS AOKI NOT TO DIVORCE JAP HUSBAND

Reconsiders—Determination, After Seeing Child's Father, and Decides to Withdraw Suit in Nevada Courts.

HAD ALREADY STARTED PRELIMINARY ACTION

CARSON, Nev., Tuesday, June 14.—Mrs. Gladys Aoki, daughter of the Archdeacon Emery, of the Episcopal Church in California, who married Genshiro Aoki, a Japanese servant working in her home, is today quoted in an interview to the effect that she would withdraw her suit for divorce.

The young woman's marriage to the Japanese caused a sensation about a year ago, recently came to Nevada and instituted preliminary proceedings for divorce.

The couple were married in Seattle and there a child was born them. Aoki has been here for about a week and during that time has been a constant visitor with his wife and child.

AFFIRMS STATEMENTS OF GENERAL ASSEMBLY

New York Presbytery Takes Steps to Avoid Repetition of Recent Experience.

NEW YORK, Tuesday, June 14.—The New York Presbytery, which warned, if not ordered, at its recent meeting, that the church's general assembly at Atlantic City, the installation of certain young clergymen, who were not clearly established, has taken steps to avoid a repetition of the experience.

To make sure that it will not receive any more candidates of the type whose answers to doctrinal questions got the local Presbytery into its late difficulty, that body has affirmed the five statements of the general assembly and pledged itself hereafter to require candidates for the ministry coming before it for examination to affirm them satisfactorily.

The five points are:

- 1—Holy scriptures are free from error.
- 2—Christ was born of a virgin.
- 3—Christ suffered for our sins.
- 4—Christ rose from the dead with the same body.
- 5—Christ showed his power by miracles.

The local Presbytery reports that it now contains fifty-seven churches whose members number 22,550. There are 183 ministers in the Presbytery, the largest number on record. The Presbytery consists of the boroughs of Manhattan, Richmond and the Bronx.

WOMAN ARRESTED FOR COMPLICITY IN MURDER

Mrs. James Boone Implicated in Husband's Death Through Confession by Arthur Ash.

SPOKANE, Tuesday, June 14.—Following the confession of Arthur Ash, to the shooting of James Boone at Deep Creek, late in April, Mrs. Boone has been arrested, charged with complicity in the crime. Ash, in his confession, he said he had been paid by the wife of the murdered man to do the killing. He accuses Boone of breaking up his home. Here, too, Mrs. Boone was confronted with the confession of Ash, but she stoutly denied any knowledge of the murder. When taken into custody she made the one significant remark: "Boone had ruined many homes," but refused to talk further of the case.

Meeting her son by a former marriage, as she was taken to the county jail, the woman said: "Gus, do you remember the time that I stepped between you and Boone and saved your life? And now to think that it has come to this!"

PRISON GUARD HIMSELF THROWN INTO DUNGEON

Man Who Allows American to Escape From Mexican Jail Undergoing Punishment.

NOGALES, Ariz., Tuesday, June 14.—Lieut. Juan Hernandez, who was in charge of the guard when Louis Fleischner, an American banker and land owner, made his sensational escape from the Mexican prison, across the border, Thursday, was thrown into a dungeon last night, to begin punishment for having allowed the American to get away. Fleischner is on his way to San Francisco and his family will immediately follow.

Fleischner was president of the American Clothing Company, doing business across the border in Nogales, Mexico. He was imprisoned on the charge of smuggling. After his escape he was arrested, this side of the request of the Mexican authorities, who at once instituted extradition proceedings. Judge Doan, of the district court at Tombstone, gave the American his freedom.


