New Liner Gets Warmest Sort of Welcome on Maiden Trip From Seattle Over Route to Rich Gold Country.

NAMESAKE CITY DONS HOLIDAY APPEARANCE

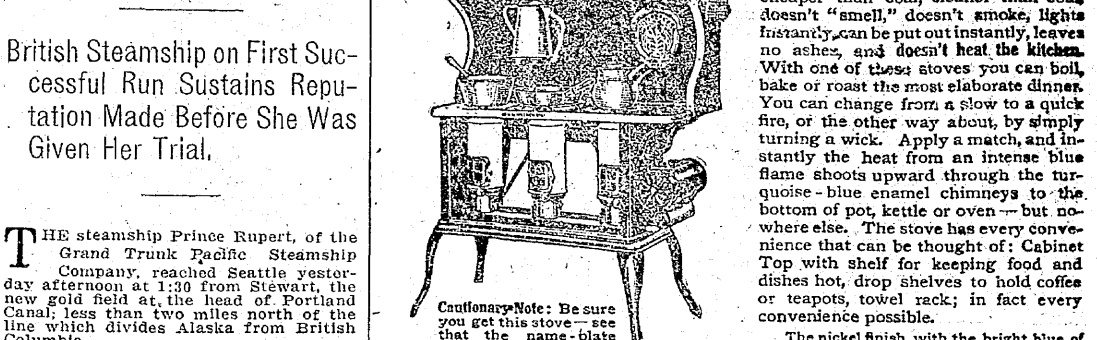

The Prince Rupert sailed at midnight on her second trip, with every accommodation according to Seattle, Victoria and Vancouver reporting that everything had been sold there.
