ON BOARD AEROPLANE SPECIAL, BROOKINS PASSED

Chicago, Thursday, Sept. 29.—Brookins passed the tower, forty miles from Gilman, at 1:36 and Harper, at 2:10, in passing Woodman, forty-six miles from Gilman, the aviator had completed two-thirds of his flight to Springfield, and had maintained his schedule throughout. He was one minute ahead of the special train.

FRENCH AVIATORS KEEN FOR AMERICAN MEET.

PARIS, Thursday, Sept. 29.—The French aviation cracks are turning their eyes toward the American meet, and the thoroughness of their preparations betrays a determination to bring back to France the international trophy, which Glenn H.
