

CHANGES WILL BE MADE IN ELECTORAL COLLEGE

Politicians of Both Parties Not Overlooking Effect of Reapportionment Bill on Party Conventions.

DEMOCRATS TO BENEFIT MOST THROUGH CHANGES.

Gains in States Where That Organization May Be Expected to Control Have Been Heavy in Ten Years.

WASHINGTON, Thursday, Jan. 25.—Politicians in both parties are not overlooking the fact that the forthcoming congressional reapportionment bill will have the effect of increasing the number of delegates in the electoral college.

W. W. Jermann, of the Crumpacker bill, proposed to increase the number of members of the House from 391 to the present number, 435.

The number of votes in the electoral college is 537. This number being secured by adding together the number of senators, 92, and the number of electors, 445.
