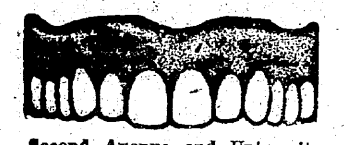
COURT ENJOINS BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS IN BATTLE OVER PAVING

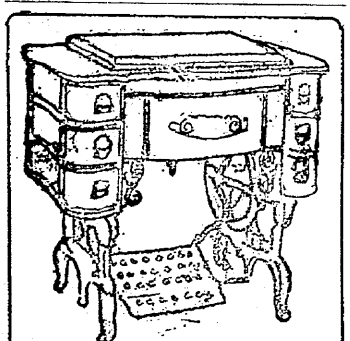

laying of the bitulithic when stopped by the restraining order issued this afternoon. The complaint on which the temporary restraining order was issued, cites the passage of the ordinance which ordered the improvement of Eleventh Avenue West by paving. The complaint recites how bids were called for and gives a summary of the bids. It shows that E. J. McCluskey Contracting Company offered to do the entire job as specified for \$29,555.92; the price per square yard for bitulithic, as shown by the complaint, was by McHugh, \$1.30 for asphaltic concrete and the Elliott Company, \$1.50, for bitulithic.

The bid of the Elliott company was accepted by the board, and it is the fact that it was the highest and over the protest of the property owners in the improvement district. The bid accepted by the board for the bitulithic paving is approximately \$2,000 higher than the bid for asphaltic concrete paving and because of this McDermott and his wife are suing the board for the difference.

Other grounds than the above are given for this order, including the fact that the bitulithic paving is a patented material; that the patents are owned and controlled exclusively by Warren Brothers Company, and that by reason of the monopoly for the patent, the bitulithic paving is effectively barred and is limited to those persons able to make the most advantageous terms with the owners of the patent.

The complaint charges further, "that the bitulithic paving material known as bitulithic is inferior in quality to the paving known as asphaltic concrete or asphalt, and by reason of the monopoly held by the Warren Brothers Company, costs more than either the asphaltic concrete or asphalt. That the patented paving known as bitulithic, and protected by United States letters of patent owned by Warren Brothers Company, has been tried in various cities in the United States, including Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis, and Seattle, and it has been shown and demonstrated that the bitulithic paving material is inferior to other known paving materials which can be laid at less cost to the property owner than bitulithic, and particularly is inferior to asphaltic concrete or asphalt paving."

The city charter is quoted. Section 14, article 8: "All improvements to be made by contract shall be let to the lowest bidder thereon."

The monopoly that would be given Warren Brothers Company, it is stated, would make this provision of no effect, and on all these grounds the temporary order was obtained and the permanent injunction applied for.

HENRY PLETSCHE LAID TO REST BY MASONS Funeral Services for Seattle Man Are Conducted From Booney-Watson Chapel.

Under the auspices of Arcana Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons, funeral services for Henry Pletsch, who died at Providence Hospital Friday afternoon, were held at the Booney-Watson chapel yesterday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Pletsch was manager of the Kiefer Meat Company and the independent Meat Company. He was 46 years old. Pletsch was born in Columbus, O., where he was engaged in the meat business for many years. On his arrival in this city he was one of the pioneers at Pike Place Market. He was prominent in Masonic circles and a charter member of the Nile Temple, Mystic Shrine. He is survived by the widow, Mrs. Louisa Pletsch, and two brothers, Jonas P. and J. Fred Pletsch, of Columbus.

JEWELER SHOT DOWN IN STORE BY BANDIT

SAN FRANCISCO, Monday, May 5.—Herman Saxe, a diamond broker, was shot and seriously wounded today in his store by a robber who fled, taking with him \$500 in coin, \$1,250 in currency and diamonds worth \$4,000, before the crime was discovered. The shooting and robbery occurred in the heart of the busy shopping district. Saxe was alone in the store when a well-dressed stranger entered and asked to be shown some diamonds, saying that he wanted to make a purchase. As the robber reached the counter, he drew a revolver and fired a bullet into Saxe's chest. He then stepped into the office at the end of the counter, opened the door in Saxe's desk and took the proprietor's revolver from it. Before Saxe could make an outcry the robber shot Saxe, who fell to the floor with a bullet wound over his heart. Hastily gathering his loot, the man departed. Saxe was found a few moments later and taken to the emergency hospital, where it is said he has a chance for recovery. The robber is described by his victim as being about 35 years old, tall, dark, smooth-shaven and well dressed.

BURNS' NEAR-SLEUTHS STINGINGLY REBUKED BY U. S. GRAND JURORS

Federal Inquisitors Flatly Decline to Return True Bill in Case of Dolly Carroll and Al Young.

demed the methods of the Burns men in seeking their cooperation to arrest the two persons involved, when no violation of the federal statutes had been committed. Further questionable procedure came to light when E. L. Sandusky, a Burns operative, was called as a witness in the grand jury. He appeared and declared that Sandusky had been sent out of two under his orders to investigate the case of Dolly Carroll and Al Young. He did not explain why this course had been pursued following instructions from the federal authorities on Saturday to produce Sandusky in court this morning.

Practically the entire morning session of the grand jury was taken up with a careful consideration of the Carroll and Young case. J. E. Tucker, the supposed victim, who said that he had been swindled out of various sums of money on the understanding that he was to marry Mrs. Carroll, occupied the stand during a greater part of the morning. Tucker, who has a wife and three children living in Tacoma, claimed that the mails had been used to defraud him out of his money.

While the testimony involved in the case was unsavory, the facts developed that not a single letter could be traced which might be shown that fraud had taken place. Young, writing to Tucker, thanked the latter for money loaned him and assured him that it would be repaid as soon as the check for the first month's pay was received. The bungling methods of the two Burns men who endeavored to trap Mrs. Carroll by means of a fictitious check, and the tactics had been watching them for two weeks, while he, in turn, was watching the Burns men who were immediately after they came to the hotel at Winslow, where Mrs. Carroll and Young were staying.

So conflicting was the testimony of the different parties involved that several of these families in the case characterized it as a mass of statements from which it was impossible to get a clear picture of what was nothing in the letter produced to indicate fraud and the dragging of the name of the Burns men into the case under a false assumption of guilt was deeply resented. "Smuggling operations," which the Burns men called to the attention of the government before the grand jury, were also mentioned in the dictagraph, turned out to be merely to involve an opium plea against the Burns men.
