Representative Raker of California was ready to urge his bill, which would exclude Japanese and other Asiatics while Representative Church, also of that state, pressed as a compromise his bill designed to bar out the Hindu Mr. Church, whose district, he says, contains more Hindus than any other district in the country, contends that the Hindu laborers injure the cause of American labor and are a detriment to the section, to which they are already coming in considerable numbers; with prospects of an immensely greater influx, he declared that there should be immediate action and that if the committee failed to act he proposed to bring up the question in the House.

WASHINGTON, Thursday, Feb. 19.—Despite efforts of the administration to prevent agitation of proposed legislation for exclusion of Asiatic immigrants pending diplomatic negotiations with Japan, Pacific Coast members were prepared to insist upon action when the House committee on immigration again considered the subject today.

Conductor John Spargur's finely balanced and masterly reading of Beethoven's Fifth Symphony and the first hearing in this city of a dramatic soprano gifted with a voice of rare lovely quality—Mme. Sibyl Sammis-MacDermid—were two of the principal features of the third Philharmonic concert at the Metropolitan Theatre last night. Another was the splendid performance of Berlioz's "Marsch der Götterkinder" by the Philharmonic players, the musicianly value of which was by no means overlooked by the audience which, as was also the case with the symphony, was generous in its appreciation and applause.

There should have been more of these, for Conductor Spargur's offerings were of a most attractive kind and his program typical of the director of the Philharmonic organization, containing besides the numbers mentioned and the songs for soprano, Von Weber's "Invitation to the Dance," heard with rapt attention and evident liking by the audience which demanded its repetition.

The Berlioz "Carnaval" was given in brilliant style, with a fine orchestral and vocal solo well maintained throughout and skillfully handled in every division, especially with the wood wind and horns. The strings were conspicuously capable in the symphony, particularly so in the second and third movements. One cannot but praise Spargur's concept of the symphony, a searching and sympathetic understanding of its beauty which he conveyed to his men, and which resulted in a well finished and wholly delightful performance.
