

Antialien Land Law Of California Upheld

RIVERSIDE, Cal., Thursday, April 5.
—The California antialien land law adopted in 1913, "does not conflict with the provisions of the treaty between the United States and Japan," according to a decision handed down here yesterday by Judge Hugh H. Craig of the superior court in the suit of the state to escheat the property here of Jukishi Harada, a Japanese.

The court rules the state had a right to "forbid ownership of land to aliens not eligible to citizenship," and that "Japanese had a right to lease but not to own real estate in California."
