MADE A LOT OF MONEY

Northern Pacific Figures for a Year.

Increase in Gross Earnings Amounts to Nearly Nine Million Dollars.

NEW YORK, Friday, Oct. 3.—In its annual report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1902, the Northern Pacific Railway Company shows an increase in gross earnings of \$8,828,396, an increase in total income of \$4,048,566; decrease in operating expenses and income for improvements \$3,555,748, and charges to capital account \$7,333,527.

The Burlington system, operated under lease, earned a surplus over amount required to meet interest on "joint 4's" of \$1,263,389. Total gross earnings of the Northern Pacific were \$41,387,394; net, \$20,098,966; surplus, \$1,547,286 (increase \$544,667). The total surplus is now \$5,064,709.

Proposed Bond Issue. NEW YORK, Friday, Oct. 3.—It is announced that at the annual stockholders' meeting of the St. Louis & San Francisco railroad to be held in St. Louis on November 10 a proposition will be made to increase the bonded indebtedness not exceeding \$18,000,000 in 4 per cent gold bonds, to be secured by a mortgage, or by the deposit as collateral security of the first mortgage bonds of the railroad constructed or acquired with the proceeds of the bond issue.

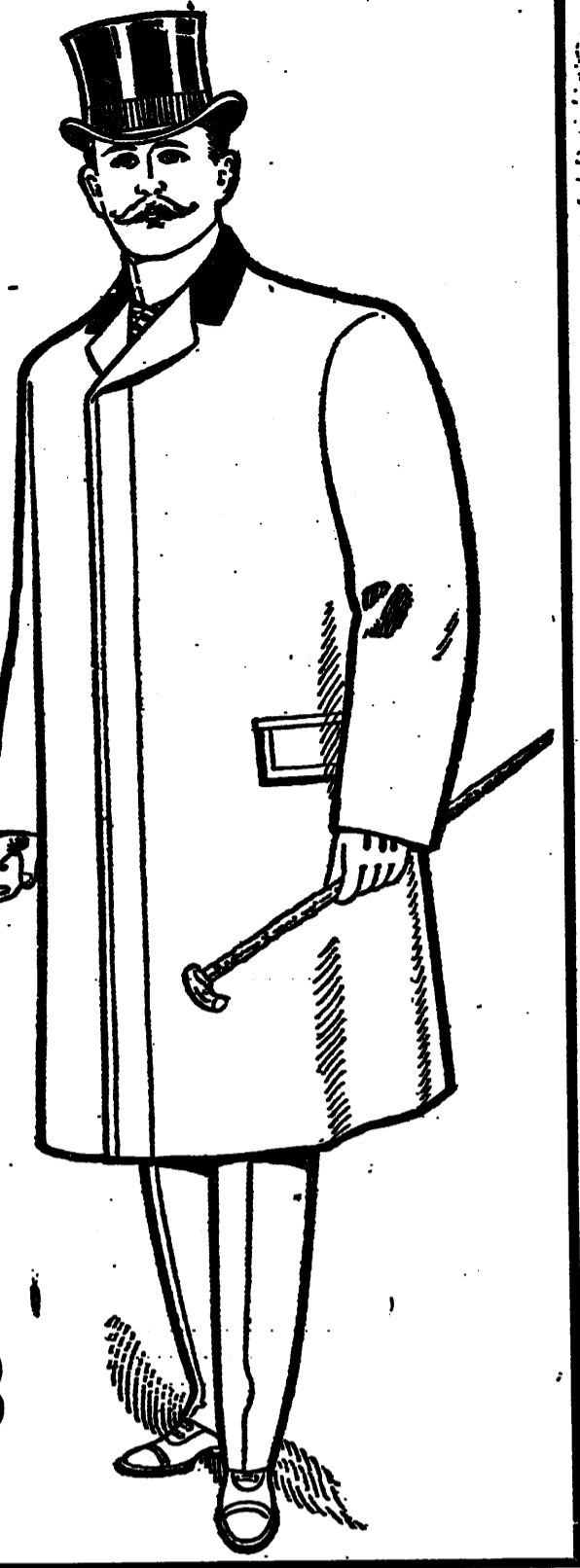
