

**Training Camp Is Moved to University**

Since the departure of the selected men for Camp Lewis, the Noncommissioned Officers' Training Camp, which was at Fifth Avenue and Bell Street, has been moved to the University Army and is ready to instruct any one who desires military training.

The camp is sponsored by the military authorities of the University and by the King County Council of Patriotic Service and is under general supervision of military authorities. It is conducted solely for patriotic purposes, to train any selected men who are desirous of receiving training that will fit them for duties of noncommissioned officers before they are called to service, and for any others who may desire the training.

The training work is under direction of Capt. P. J. Perry. It is entirely free of cost. Drill is held Saturday from 2 to 4 p. m. and Sunday from 10 o'clock to noon and from 1 o'clock to 3 o'clock.

**Pigskin for Shoes**

Editor The Times:

I wish to call your attention to the fact that enough skins to make sufficient leather to supply the entire United States with shoes, is permitted to go to waste without benefitting anyone but the meat packers. I refer to the skins of hogs.

It may be that pig skin will not make a leather suitable for the uppers of shoes, nevertheless it will make good soles, and provide a good substitute for leather that is now used for other purposes, instead of shoes.

I am sure that the government should permit the packers to be permitted to keep it on the pig, and sell the skin in this way for the same price that the meat brings, it is more profitable for them to leave the skin on the hog than to sell the skin separately. Therefore in order to stop this tremendous waste of material, it will be necessary to make a law compelling the packer to skin the hog instead of scrapping him and also to forbid the sale of pork with the skin on it.

In the year 1915, the latest statistics in the United States, and it is a safe estimate that there is more than 50,000,000 slaughtered each year in this country, the hides of which are sold to the public at the same price that the hog is sold for. If the pig goes with the meat, and the public pays meat prices for the hides, and the packer is permitted to keep the skin, whereas if the skin were removed and made into leather, the price of leather would fall very materially, and the price of pork would not be affected in any way.

**SEATTLE CHILDREN WILL DO BIT FOR LIBERTY LOAN**

Seattle school children will do their bit in stimulating interest in the Second Liberty Loan.

"Why Buy a Liberty Bond?" will be the subject of competitive compositions to be written by all of the English classes in the Seattle schools by the four upper grades of the grammar schools.

The plan was suggested to the School Board by the publicity committee of the Liberty Loan Committee and was endorsed by the board at a special meeting. Superintendent of Schools Frank B. Cooper yesterday sent a circular letter to all school principals instructing them to have the boys and girls prepare the compositions by next Wednesday. The winning essays from each school will be sent to the office of the superintendent and selected by the Liberty Loan Committee for publication in the interest of the big Liberty Bond campaign.

**Store Windows Offered.**

Announcement was made today by Chairman E. Lord, chairman of the committee that Frederick & Nelson have offered to devote their entire window space for Saturday evening, Sunday and Monday to furthering the Liberty Loan campaign. No merchandise of any kind will be displayed in the store frontage, from Madison in the Spring Street, during that period.

The windows will be devoted to tableaux, especially conceived and arranged by the store's display staff, designed to bring to the attention of the citizenry in a vivid and impressive manner the vital importance of Seattle's wholehearted participation in the government in floating the Second Liberty Loan.

A spectacular feature of the display upon which the curtains will be raised at 7:30 Saturday evening will be the unveiling of the Liberty Loan flag, a large size symbolizing the urgency of America's mission in the present world crisis, being the first in the United States to stage a display of this kind in connection with a patriotic more than \$1,000,000.

**Totals in Washington.**

No report has as yet come from the amount already subscribed by the other cities named in the telegram from the committee early in the week placing the amount at considerably more than \$1,000,000.

**Good Progress Made.**

Thurston County reports excellent progress and is the first to reach its allotment. C. Lord, chairman of the committee for Thurston County reported to State Chairman J. A. Swallow today that Thurston County has already subscribed and by October 15 will have a total subscription of \$500,000.

A big street forum, similar to that of last Tuesday, will be staged by the Liberty Loan committee on Saturday morning night. Meetings will be held every block on Second Avenue from Pike Street to Yesler Way.

**IF LOANS FAIL CREDIT OF U. S. IS GONE, SAYS M'ADOO**

SAN FRANCISCO, Friday, Oct. 12.—William G. McAdoo, secretary of the treasury, sounded a new note in his campaign to speed up the raising of the total \$5,000,000 subscription to the Liberty Loan, which he warned the nation that should the present or any subsequent issue of bonds fail in the war, the credit of this government would be destroyed.

"If the nation is undermined," the secretary declared, "what is property worth to the rich man, what is life worth to the free man?"

**LESS THAN 7 PER CENT OF LOAN SUBSCRIBED**

WASHINGTON, Friday, Oct. 12.—Less than 7 per cent of the \$5,000,000 subscription to the Liberty Loan has been reported to date, according to figures obtained in subscriptions to the second Liberty Loan had been subscribed at 11:30 a. m. today, according to Treasury officials made public the subscription figures last night. The total \$5,000,000 subscription is closed every dollar reported to the reserve banks from every section of the United States. One reserve district, however—Minneapolis—reported no figures.

The subscriptions indicate the necessity for the hardest kind of work on the part of the whole country for the balance of the campaign, reads the Treasury Department's announcement. The campaign is more than one-third gone. Fourteen working days remain.

**DRIVE'S LAST DAYS MUST SHOW GAINS**

Sales of Liberty Bonds Throughout Country Not Up to Official Expectations.

NEW YORK, Friday, Oct. 12.—Operations in the securities market this week were curtailed to an extent by the observance of a double holiday, but the proceeds of the Liberty Loan campaign, which continued, were not so much affected.

Shares of all descriptions, particularly in the Liberty Loan, were down seven points to their shrinkage of the past month. Liberty issues were hard hit, suspension of the dividend on the People's Gas being preceded and followed by extreme losses of 10 to 20 points.

Declines of rails, many of which touched lowest quotations of the year and not a few for many years, excited widespread comment, inasmuch as the movement included shares of high intrinsic value. Steady offerings of these stocks occasioned much conjecture respecting future dividends.

Numerous additional statements of railroad earnings compiled by the Interstate Commerce Commission accounted for the revival of agitation for increased freight rates. The demand of the railway employees east of Chicago for a 10 per cent increase in pay added to the complicated conditions already existing in the transportation field.
