

Caarelessness of Boards Causes Trouble When Canvass Is About to Begin.

The official canvass of King County

The official canvass of King County primary returns, originally intended to begin this morning, will not be started until tomorrow. Presiding Judge Calvin S. Hall, who normally would head the canvassing board, has refused to act because he is interested in the judicial returns and his associates on the bench have olcked Judge Mitchell Gilliam to act in his place. County Auditor Norman M. Wardall and Chairman Claude C. Ramsay of the Board of County Commissioners, are the other members.

The judiciary returns apparently are hopelessly involved, and if an accurate estimate of the number of votes cast for Supreme and Superior Court Judges is to be obtained the ballot boxes will have to be opened. Whether or not this will be done will be submitted to Prosecuting Attorney A. H. Lundin by the canvassing board tomorrow.

The election officials did not count the number of ballots cast for sixyear term Supreme Court judges or for Superior Court Judges in all the precincts. In a few the count was accurately made; in others no attention was paid to the matter and in still others the total vote cast for all candidates was certified in as the number of ballots cast.

The way the returns came in is illustrated in the fight for Supreme Court justices, two-year term. There were only two candidates, Walter M. French, who received 15,689, and Warren W. Tolman, who was given 12,118. It is manifest on the face of these figures that 27,807 persons voted for these two candidates, yet the election officials say that but 20,370 voters took part. This discrepancy is easily traced to the fact that many precincts made no return on the number voting.

For six-year term judges it is asserted that 39,666 persons cast ballots. This figure appears to be preposterous for other returns show that but 5,683 Democrats and 31,470 Republicans took part in the primaries. In other words, the returns would say that but 36,553 persons cast 39,685 ballots for candidates for the Supreme Court.

In the King County contest the official returns indicate 32,287 ballots were cast by that number of persons voting for judge of the Superior Court.

This total does not harmonize with any other figures and the auditor's clorks tabulating the official returns declare that they are erroneous on their face. Before the canvassing board neets Auditor Wardall will prepare a list of precincts showing those where accurate returns were given; where no return was made, and where the election officials totaled the vote cast for all candidates.

## ORGANIZED LABOR

IN honor of the 20,862 members of the International Association of Ma-chinists who have been called to the

International Association of Machinists who have been called to the colors since the war began. Hope Lodge No. 79 of Machinists and Helpers last night dedicated and draped above its charter in Hall 201 of the Labor Temple a handsome international service flag. Dedication of the flag was made the occasion for a rousing patriotic demonstration by an audience of more than 400 lodge members.

The flag was sent to Hope Lodge by J. W. Kelly, one of its members, who for the last three months has been working in the East as an organizer for the international association, and was presented to the lodge on Kelly's behalf by A. W. Hoch, assistant business agent. In making the presentation Hoch praised the patriotism of the men who had gone to fight to establish world democracy and paid a feeling tribute to thirty who had already fallen in battle, and who are commemorated by a large gold star in the service flag.

James C. Bell, president of the lodge who lost one brother with the American forces in France a few weeks aro and who has another brother in the trenches, accepted the flag with a fitting response.

Seek Constitutional Charges.

Seek Constitutional Charges Another feature of the machinists' weekly meeting was the indorsement by unanimous vote of resolutions recently adopted by the Schenectady, N. Y., local lodge of machinists, urging that the metal trades department of the American Federation of Labor be given greater powers than it now possesses to further union organization.

possesses to further union organization.

The resolution sets forth the fact that the department is now hampered by restrictions imposed by the consitutions of its component international unions and urges that these laws be changed to permit the department to function for its internationals in all cases where a two-thirds vote of the department delegates is cast for or against any proposition.

Forty-eight new members were initiated and sixty-four applications for membership received.

STRUCTURAL IRON WORKERS INDORSE CONVENTION REPORT

Delegates who attended the semi-annual convention of the Northwest Conference of Bridge and Structural Iron Workers, recently held at Portland, made their report to Bridge and Structural Iron Workers and Pile Drivers Local Union No. 85, at its weekly meeting last night. The report was read by William Clements and was indorsed as a whole by the local union. The establishment of a standard minimum wage of \$1 an hour, or \$\$ a day for structural iron workers in the Northwest was the leading recommendation of the convention.

PACKING HOUSE WORKERS TO ADMIT JAPANESE TO UNION

That the most effective way of meeting the competition of the Japanese is to organize him, was the decision made by Butcher Workmen's Local Union No. 186, at its weekly meeting, held in the Labor Temple last night. As a result of the decision, the union will admit to membership Japanese now employed in Seattle packing houses. About thirty Japanese are said to be affected by the decision.

The constitution of the Amalgamated Association of Meat Cutters and Butcher Workmen, with which Local 186 is affiliated, contains no provision excluding Asiatics from membership, and the local union therefore found itself free to solve the local problem to suit its own conditions.

The union concurred in the action of the Central Labor Council in indorsing and recommending for adoption a resolution introduced in the City Council by Councilman T. H. Bolton for the establishmen of a contral rental hureau to deal with the housing problem and to eliminate rent profiteering by abolishing all private rental agencies.

Seven new members were initiated.

LABOR DELEGATION REACHES ITALY TO MEET WITH FELLOWS

NEW YORK, Tuesday, Sept. 17.—Arrival in Italy of an American Federation of Labor mission was announced today here by the American Alliance for Labor and Democracy. The mission is separate from that now in England headed by Samuel Gompers, although their objects are similar James Wilson, president of the Pattern Makers' League of America, heads the Italian mission.


