

JAPANESE MADE CITIZEN

Honolulu Judge Admits Man Who
Served in U. S. Army.

HONOLULU, T. H., Monday, Jan. 20.—Four hundred Japanese who enlisted in the United States Army immediately may apply for and obtain citizenship in the United States, according to a ruling made here by United States District Judge Horace W. Vaughan. Judge Vaughan Friday granted citizenship to Sachi Shimodo, a Japanese, who enlisted here, after naturalization had been refused by W. H. Ragsdale, naturalization examiner.

United States Attorney Huber will make a test case in the federal courts of the granting of citizenship to Shimodo.
