continue operation during the period of the strike, or until its stock of provisions is depleted. Sufficient food is on hand according to Miss Chiose Clark, in charge of the Commons, to last for two weeks, unless patronage at the Commons should increase materially during the strike.

Much of the food at the university is stored in the kitchen, she believes that all of the cooking could be done by steam, as this is utilized to a large extent at the present time. Baking could be done in the kitchen of the university dormitories, where cook stoves are installed.

GENERAL STRIKE COMMITTEE TO COOPERATE WITH POLICE

That it is the intention of the general strike committee through its subcommittee on law and order to appoint a union police force to cooperate with Chief Warren's department in every way and not to work at cross purposes with it, was the unofficial statement given out at the Labor Temple today following a conference Mayor Hanson had with a number of prominent unionists regarding the matter.

The intention of the labor committee, it was said, is to draw members of the volunteer police force from each of the larger unions and to place over them as chief some man of recognized executive ability and experience, preferably a returned army officer holding a union card. A search is now being made for such an officer.

The committee explained its purpose as being to see that unionists are kept strictly within the law and thereby placing the responsibility for disorder that a lawless element outside of the union jurisdiction may create. The proposed union police force will be as large numerically as the regular police force.

An official statement regarding the plans for the appointment of the volunteer police will be made by the executive committee of the general strike committee after a meeting being held in the Labor Temple this afternoon.

question of police control (day became apparent.

Mayor Hanson, when asked what the situation with respect to crime and disorder would be if a strike at the municipal lighting plant darkened the streets, declared emphatically that the city will continue to operate the light plants and that he will not permit the men on the job walk out. The city's police will continue on the job, he said, and the seat of the municipal government will still be at the City Hall.

When Chief Warren's attention was called to the statement of the labor publicity committee, he remarked that the city has a right to give any advice it chose but Seattle's streets will stay open and citizens can come and go as they please any hour of the day or night.

No 8 o'clock Curfew.

"There will be no 8 o'clock curfew," he said, "and the responsibility rests on the police department. So far as I know, there will be no divided responsibility. It is our job and we are going to see that it is done, by doing it ourselves. If there is any one who thinks disorder will be tolerated here, that one should change his notion here and now."

Quit Effort at Mediation.

In announcing that the industrial relations committee, a local organization formed of representative business men and representatives of labor leaders, had quit its efforts toward mediation, Chairman George Donworth late yesterday afternoon gave out the following statement:

"The committee has discontinued its session believing it can be of no further assistance at this time. Donworth would add in addition to the official announcement was that "anybody is welcome to try to bring about a settlement."

Not for the present, if ever, will the industrial relations committee divulge what it has learned towards an adjustment of the differences between the striking shipyard workers and the shipyard owners. The committee has been disposed to let the results of its work become manifest without any discussion on the part of members.

The full committee, composed of seven men from the business life of Seattle, with Judge Donworth the fifteenth meeting chairman, sat in yesterday's meeting.

LATEST DEVELOPMENTS IN CITY'S STRIKE SITUATION

DEVELOPMENTS in the threatened general strike situation in Seattle in the last 24 hours are:

POLICE CONTROL—Mayor Hanson says city police officers will continue to operate the light and water systems and care for sanitation. Federal officers meet to take steps to prevent interference with governmental activities, including Lake Washington canal, cables, telegraphs, assay office, etc.

MEDIATION—Seattle's industrial relations committee abandons attempts to mediate shipyard strike, and union workers are going forward with strike plans.

FOOD—Union leaders announce kitchens, where between 300,000 and 400,000 meals can be prepared daily, will be established and strikers and persons who have no other place to procure food, will be served cafeteria style, in large halls. Seattle Milk Dealers' Association will supply milk at central stations for children less than five years of age, and invalids.

GAS AND ELECTRICITY FOR COOKING—Still uncertain whether sufficient employees will remain at posts to operate plants. Mayor Hanson says city plans to provide to keep schools running to public streets.

STREET LIGHTS—Mayor says city plant will run.

SANCTION—Concern increases in labor unions as to standing of Seattle locals with their international unions if they go on local sympathetic strike. Typographical Union gets telegram from international union refusing sanction to strike. Longshoremen already threatened with cancellation of charter if they strike.

SCHOOLS—Because of striking firemen and engineers, it is uncertain whether heat can be provided to keep schools running to public streets.

HOTELS—Managers fear hotels may be compelled to close because of lack of heat, light, elevator service, clean linen, household service, etc.

TELEPHONES AND TELEGRAPH—Arrangements made by telegraph companies to handle emergency business after Thursday. Up to date, no action by unions has been taken to interfere with service, which is regarded as public necessity. Telephone operators vote on strike question tonight.

STREET CARS AND JITNEYS—Street cars will stop when 10 o'clock arrives Thursday morning, hoist a "To the Barn" sign and return to barns. Jitney drivers will take no passengers after 9 o'clock, completing all trips so no passenger will have to walk.


