Death Takes George W. Perkins Illness Contracted During War

Noted Financier Had Attack of Influenza While Aiding Soldiers in France.

WON BUSINESS SUCCESS

By Associated Press. NEW YORK, Friday, June 18.—George W. Perkins, financier, died this morning at the Stamford Hall Sanitarium, Stamford, Conn. It became known June 11 that Mr. Perkins had suffered a nervous breakdown, but members of his family did not believe at that time that his life was in danger.

GEORGE W. PERKINS, financier and friend of late Colonel Roosevelt, who died early today in Stamford, Conn.



The affection to which Mr. Perkins succumbed is believed to have been the result of influenza and pneumonia contracted while serving with the U. S. Army in France during the war. A statement by the dead financier's physicians given out at Mr. Perkins' office on the time of his death 2:15 this morning: "Death resulted from an attack of acute inflammation of the brain, the result of complete nervous exhaustion due to intense and continuous overwork."

Death Was Unexpected. The death of Mr. Perkins was unexpected. It was said at his office on account of his having recently survived a very serious heart attack, after which his family and friends believed his constitution sufficiently robust to throw off the malady.

George Walbridge Perkins was born in Chicago on January 31, 1862. He received only a common school education and later he began to read his way up in the business world. He achieved such success in financial affairs that he attracted the attention of J. P. Morgan and in 1891 made a member of the Morgan banking firm. His interests were diversified and he became identified with many large corporations.

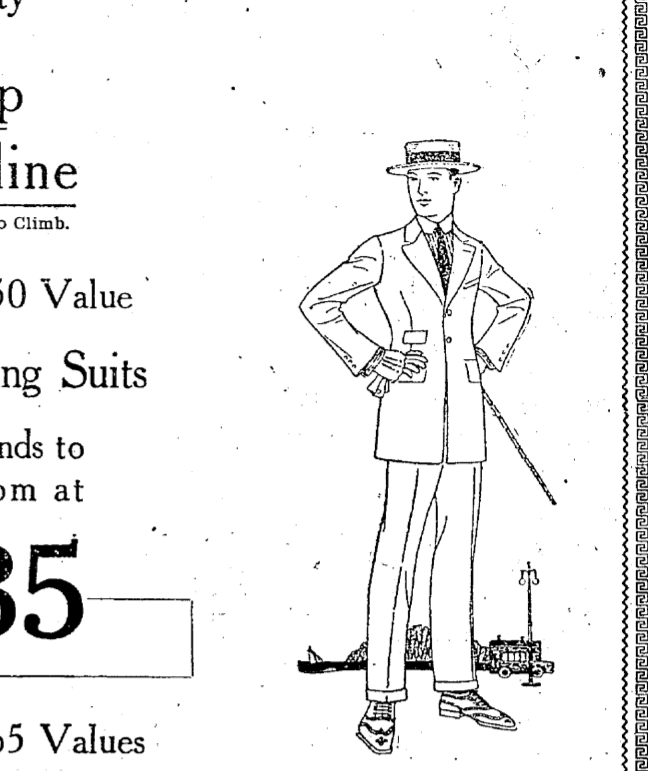
