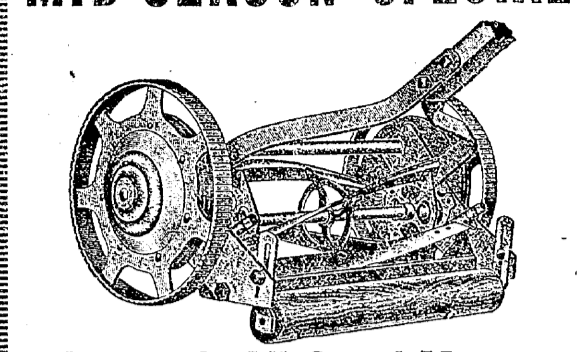

SOLONS HEAR WITNESSES

Kanazaki, secretary of the Japanese Association of America, told the immigration and naturalization committee of the House of Representatives yesterday that he believed in restriction of Japanese immigration in the United States but that 30,000 to 40,000 more could properly be admitted in addition to the 75,000 already here.

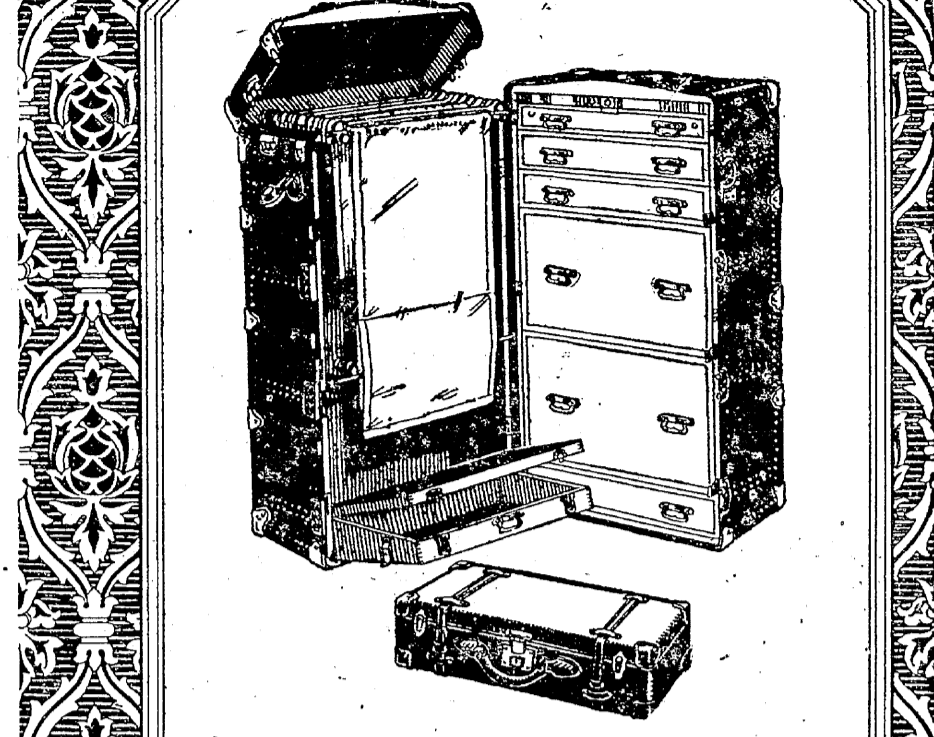
Notorious Crook Vanishes in Air

DEFENDS INJUNCTION

New York Judge Would Use Preventive Measures. ROCHESTER, N. Y., Tuesday, July 20.—Defense of the use of injunctions in labor disputes and a plea for a recognition of reciprocal rights and a return to the "spirit of law and equity" in the complaint constitute a crime under the penal statutes of the state.
