Promotion of Major Wins Confirmation

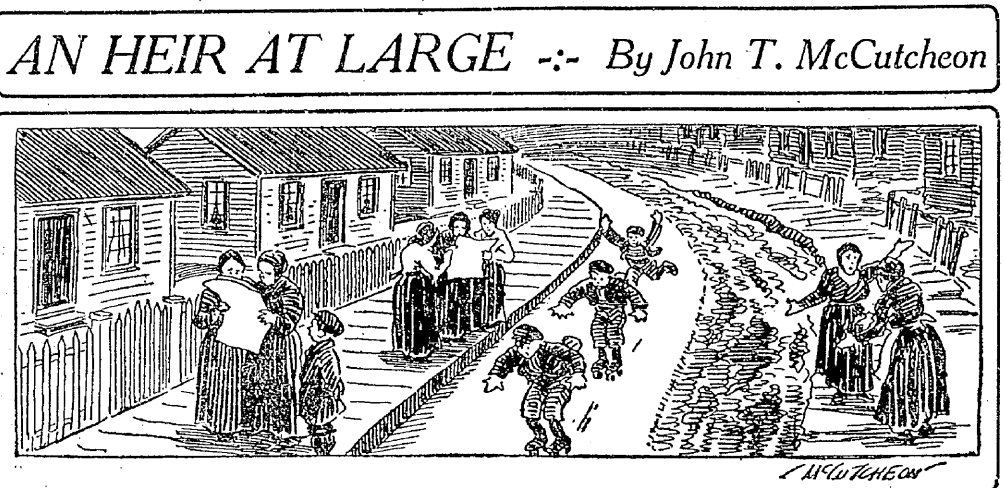
