

STARTLING FIGURES GIVEN TO U. S. EDUCATORS.

More Than \$4,300,000 Acknowledged Illiterates to Cast Ballot This Year.

WASHINGTON, Tuesday, July 1.— More than 4,300,000 illiterates Will be entitled to vote in November for President of the United States and members of Congress, the illiteracy commission of the National Education Association stated in a report today to the association's convention here.

The illiteracy report, presented by Mrs. Cora W. Stewart of Frankfort, Ky., stated that although there are 4,931,905 acknowledged illiterates in the United States, the commission is convinced there are more than double convinced there are more than double
