WATER PRESSURE INQUIRY PRESSED BY UNDERWRITERS

Insurance Companies Determined to Find Out Conditions of Mains and Reservoirs During Big Fire.

VARIOUS insurance companies interested in the fire which caused a loss of more than \$800,000 on Automobile Row last Saturday night are making close inquiry into the water supply of the district in which the fire occurred and their investigation will include the water mains and conditions governing the water pressure.

Difference of opinion exists as to whether low water pressure or lack of adequate water supply caused a delay that was, in a measure, responsible for the rapid spread of the fire and the sweeping extent of the damage. Insurance men say there was a considerable lapse of time before the pressure was sufficient to be effective; that it became stronger after the flames had gained great headway and spread from the building in which it originated to adjoining structures.

Insurance engineers have said that the gate valves which were feeding the supply direct from the main pipe lines while the Volunteer Park reservoir was temporarily out of commission were not opened sufficiently wide to admit a full supply until men could be sent from the Water Department to open the valves, however. George F. Russell of the Water Department, Mr. Russell says there was ample supply of water and the valve gates were open.

These disputed points are being investigated by the insurance representatives who also are planning to submit to the city and county suggestions that the water pressure in the area be increased in some manner that should be devised by city engineers. As the conditions complained of were a repetition of those prevailing at the time of the Mitchell, Lewis & Staver fire on the row two years ago, the charge is made that the City Council has been negligent in not improving the situation in some manner since that time.

PLAN ANOTHER HUNT FOR "MISSING LINK"

SAN FRANCISCO, Thursday, Nov. 5.—American paleontological sleuths are on the trail of the "missing link" and expect to find him, soon, dead or alive.

That is the news brought back from the Gobi Desert in Mongolia by Dr. Roy Chapman Andrews, noted scientist, who is en route to New York today with a large collection of fossils and other specimens of that remote time when man is supposed by evolutionists to have been a cave person.

Dr. Andrews, Mrs. Andrews and their party arrived here yesterday. The scientist led the third Asiatic expedition of the American Museum of Natural History. He said before leaving for the East that a fourth expedition to the Gobi desert was planned to start in April next.

Expedition Decried Successful.

The object of the expedition "is to find material with which to reconstruct that portion of the story of animal and human life which lies beyond the reach of history. All members of the party are pleased with the success attained and believe the discovery of further links in the chain connecting man with lower forms of life is near. Dr. Andrews says the many and startling things they found have strengthened more than ever his belief in man's evolutionary development.

Among the noteworthy discoveries in Gobi were dinosaur eggs. The scientists brought back about forty on this trip. They were large enough to please the most exacting primates, butter and egg man. Besides these eggs, many fossils of reptiles, fish, birds and mammals were brought back for the museum. Among them is a baluchitherium, supposed to have been the largest land mammal that ever lived. It is supposed to be 3,000,000 years old. Bones and implements of ancient men are among the relics.

Cradle of Human Race.

Proof that man lived when many of the now extinct mammals roamed the earth is found in the fact that marks on the bones of these animals were unquestionably made by men and the fact that implements such as spearheads, axes, etc., were found in the same geological strata in which the animal fossils were found.

Dr. Andrews believes that Asia escaped the ice caps which 50,000 or more years ago came down over Europe and America, thus giving life in Asia better opportunity to develop. He said remains of mammals had been found there which previously had been found only in Europe and America. In fact, he said that virtually every form of life could find a prototype in Asia, leading to the belief that it was possibly the place of origin of life on the planet and in all probability the cradle of the human race.

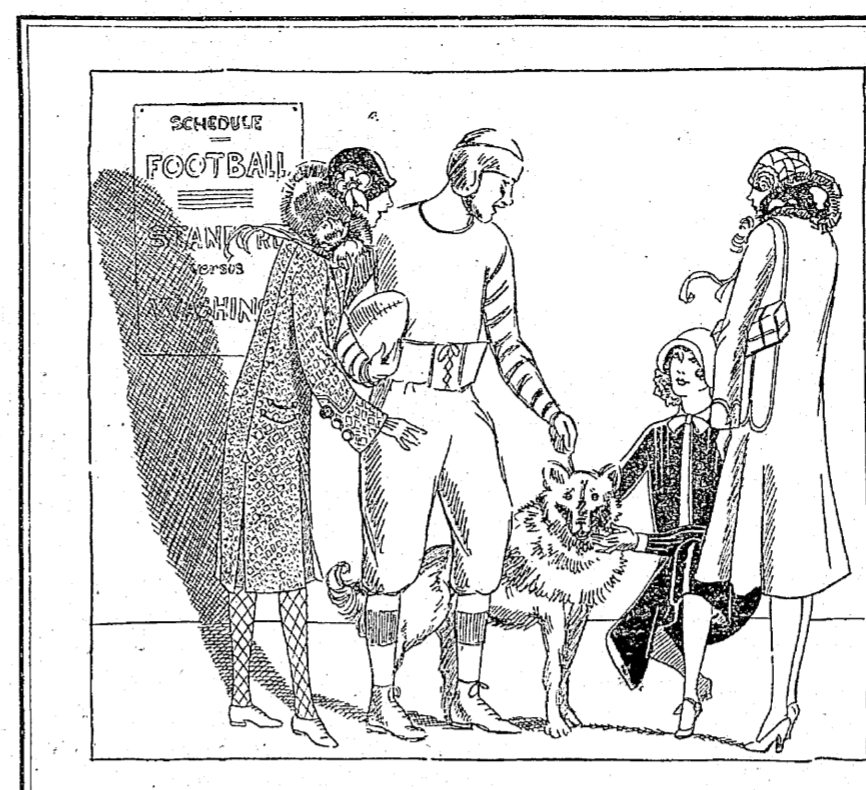

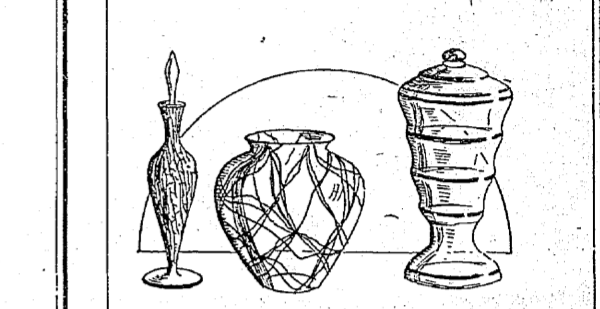

Japanese Prince in New York Will Play Golf With Hayakawa, Tennis With Shimzu

NEW YORK, Thursday, Nov. 5.—Princess Asaka, sister of the Emperor of Japan, and her husband, Prince Asaka, who likes to dance and play golf and tennis, are visiting New York. They are on the way home after a three-year tour.

Japanese and American diplomats met them at the pier when they arrived on the liner Paris. The royal couple greeted their compatriots according to Japanese custom, which requires deep obeisances and does not permit persons of lower rank to touch them. But they shook hands cordially with all the Americans they met, including two policemen assigned as bodyguards.

Photographers got all the pictures they wanted and the royal pair talked to reporters through Viscount Sohma, of their entourage, who speaks English. Both of them like to dance, and they danced at the Astor Hotel last night. The Prince expects to play golf with Sessue Hayakawa, the Japanese screen star, and tennis with Z. Shimizu, the Japanese champion.

The Princess was dressed in a fawn-colored frock, with a fur neckpiece of the same color, and wore a pink rose in the lapel of her coat. She is taller than the Prince.
