United States Commissioner of Reclamation Files Plans for Yakima River Development With State.

CLYMPIA, Tuesday, March 25.— Bearing the approval of Dr. Elwood Mead, United States Commissioner of Mead, United States Commissioner of the Bureau of Reclamation, a report revealing for the first time the accepted plans for the development, at a cost of \$15,800,000, of the federal government's next big reclamation project in Washington State, yesterday was placed on file with Erie J. Barnes, director of agriculture and of the Department of Conservation and Development.

The new project, known as the Roza division of the Yakima River watershed development. includes

watershed development, includes 66,000 acres of arid land extending from Moxee City, a few miles south east of Yakima to a point near Ben-ton City in Benton County.

Construction Starts in 1933. Construction work, the report said, will begin in 1933, the year after the completion of the Kittitas Division, which is scheduled for the summer

Recommendations in the repor Recommendations in the report represent the conclusions of a special board of engineers and economists which met at Yakima February 13 at the request of Commissioner Mead. The findings of the board were withheld from publication until after they had been reviewed, and approved by the bureau.

The board ruled against proposals involving the joint construction of

The board ruled against proposals involving the joint construction of the Roza and Kennewick divisions of the Yakima project but recommended that construction of the Kennewick unit be undertaken after the Roza unit is completed. The Kennewick project will be the last unit of the Yakima River development ment.

The recommendations of the board as approved by Commissioner Mead

as approved by Commissioner areau were:

1.—That the construction of, the Roza division begin as soon as funds are available, considering the requirements of the Cle Elum reservoir, for which \$1,500,000 has already been appropriated. The Kittitas division now under construction and the relief of the Kennewick highlands, which includes about four thousand acres, served by a small system that the board reported was in need of repair.

2. It is understood that construction of the Kennewick division will follow that of the Roza division.

3. The Roza division contains 66,000 acres, of which 45,300 must be served by a gravity canal and 20,700 by direct cononection and electric pumping plants. The entire project, the board estimated, will cost approximately \$240 an acre.

Kennewick Costs \$450,000. 4. The estimated cost of improvements in connection with the Highlands at Kennewick is \$450,000 and includes 4,000 acres, of which 2,600 is now in a highly developed state of cuitivation.

cultivation.

5. The Roza canal will be 100 miles long. Water will be diverted from the Yakima River midway between Yakima and Ellensburg. The division covers an area of land in the Selah and Moxee Valleys but covers the greatest area, above the Sunnyside Canal in lower Yakima Valley.

6. Power will be developed by plants constructed at points along the canal for the purpose of pumping water to levels above the main canal.


Sam M'GEE, Logger, IS FOUND DEAD
