BROCK, SCHLEE HOP IN ATTEMPT TO MAKE RECORD

World Flyers Take Off From Jacksonville, Fla., for San Diego on Round Trip One-Stop Flight.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Monday, June 17.—William S. Brock and Edward F. Schlee flew westward under overcast skies today in a contemplated dawn-to-dusk flight to San Diego, Cal., and return.

They lifted their Lockheed-Vega monoplane from the hard packed sands of the beach here at 2:32 a. m. (P. S. T.) as a moderate-sized crowd looked on.

The two flyers of "round-the-world fame" hoped to break three records: East-to-west, and the transcontinental round trip flight.

Route of the flight westward depended mainly on the weather reports they expected to pick up from radio stations en route.

Course of Brock-Schlee flight is approximately 600 miles shorter than the New York to Los Angeles route, and as a result the men hoped to complete the round trip in slightly more than twenty-four hours.

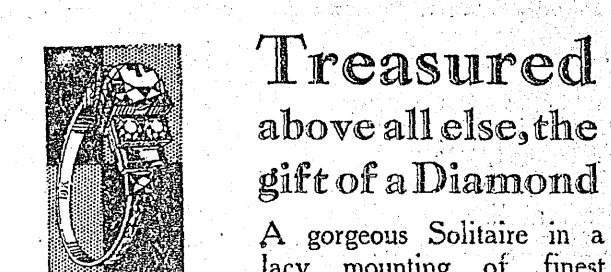
Court Rules Landholder Has Right to Restrict Occupancy to White Race.
