HARD TIMES HAVE REDUCED ESTATES OF EXILED KAISER

By Associated Press. DOORN, Holland, Wednesday, March 14.—Hard times have overtaken the once immensely wealthy former Kaiser Wilhelm II, of Germany.

Just how hard the Hohenzollerns have been hit is not known. A year ago, representatives in Berlin admitted their finances had suffered.

As a result of a plebiscite in 1926, a compromise financial agreement was reached between the Ketz and the Hohenzollerns. The ex-Kaiser was given 15,000,000 marks in cash and retained title to 165,000 acres—some of it valuable forest land.

178 INFANTS AND CHILDREN SAVED AS HOME BURNS

By Associated Press. ALBANY, N. Y., Wednesday, March 14.—One hundred and seventy-eight infants and children either were carried or led to safety today as fire broke out in the infants' home of the Brady Maternity Hospital in the Pine Hills section of Albany.

The fire, which originated in the carpenter shop in the basement, was extinguished quickly without causing severe damage. Smoke filled the corridors.

Seventy-four infants, all a few weeks old, were removed by nurses to the maternity home across the street and to nearby residences.

One hundred and four other children, between 3 and 5 years of age, were marched to safety by nuns. They were fully clothed when the fire broke out, ready to go to a nearby playground.

POWER OUTPUT UP 18 PCT. IN YEAR

By Associated Press. NEW YORK, Wednesday, March 14.—Last week's electric power output for the country was 18.4 per cent ahead of the same week last year, the Edison Electric Institute reported today. This is one of the largest percentage gains ever reported in official figures giving yearly comparisons.

The week's output of 1,647,024,000 kilowatt hours was off slightly from the previous week, which showed a consumption of 1,638,040,000 kilowatt hours. In the corresponding week of 1933 production was 1,390,607,000 kilowatt hours.

Under the new scale, employees with the company six to eighteen months will receive increases in pay from \$1 to \$5 weekly in excess of code rates.

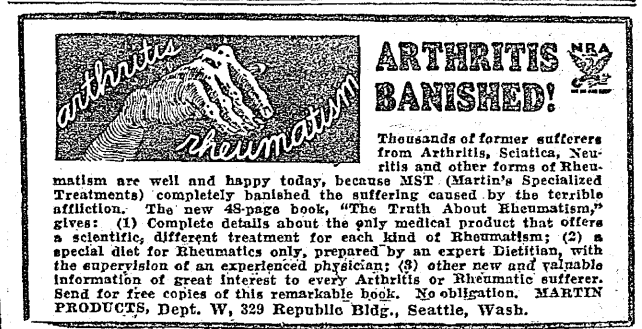
