

## CAPITOL HILL TO STUDY CAR PLAN

Trackless trolleys to serve Capitol Hill, via Olive Way, is a proposal to be submitted soon for consideration by the traffic committee of the Capitol Commercial Club.

Robert O. Jones, club leader, said today that the proposal will be filed by C. G. Bean, Capitol Hill resident.

"Bean's plan would be useful to the apartment house district on Capitol Hill and would enable a thousand stenographers to take a short cut to work every morning," said Jones.

"Nickel fares would be favored in this short trip."

A proposed run is to have the south terminal at the County-City Building with the trackless trolleys to run south in Third Avenue to Yester Way, north in Second Avenue to Stewart Street, east in Stewart Street and Olive Way to North Broadway, north in Broadway to East Mercer Street, east in Mercer to 15th Avenue, north, south in 15th Avenue to East John Street and west in John to Olive Way.

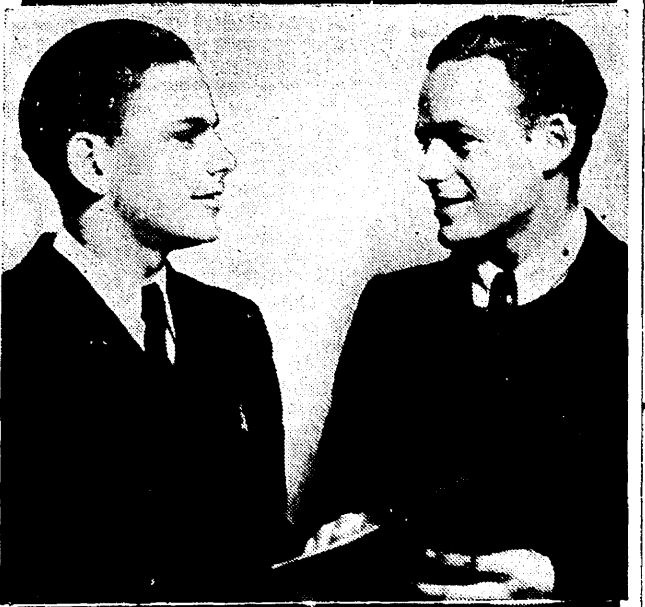
