

HEART STROKE KILLS PRISONER

Serving a ten-day sentence after being charged with disorderly conduct, Gus A. Cizek, 30-year-old laborer, suffered a fatal heart attack in the jail last night. When he was stricken he was removed to Harborview County Hospital after emergency treatment by Dr. O. J. Blendle, City Hospital doctor. He died shortly after his arrival at Harborview. Cizek lived at 1801 Ninth Ave.

All shots are made with a single club having a double-ended rubber head resembling a polo mallet in a new game combining golf and polo.

Red Executioners 'Liquidate' Fascists' Leaders at Madrid

One thousand determined Spanish rebels stormed the mountain defense of Irun, government-held city near the Franco-Spanish border, in a bitter hand-to-hand battle today, but apparently defenders were holding their positions. Meanwhile, French newspapers quoted refugees from Spain today as saying 100 Fascist rebels, many of them formerly high in the Spanish government, were executed in Madrid as a reprisal for an attempt to burn a jail where Fascist prisoners were held.

Notables Executed. Among the notables reported by the refugees were: Gen. Oswaldo Fernandez Capaz, former military commander in Morocco; Admiral Francisco Salas, former minister of marine; Rico Avello, former minister of treasury and high commissioner in Morocco; Dr. Jose Maria Albarran, leader of the National Traditionalist Party; the Marquis de Urquijo, a banker, and Fernando Primo de Rivera, cousin of the Fascist leader; Jose Martinez de Valasco, former foreign minister, and Melguades Alvarez, former cabinet minister.

The rebel chiefs who would rule Spain disclosed today they planned a military dictatorship—and then, if the people want it, restoration of the monarchy. Entrenching themselves about their Burgos stronghold against a sudden thrust by forces of the Socialist government, the Fascist leaders let it be known their intended military dictatorship would be followed by a plebiscite on the return of the Bourbon throne.

Former King Alfonso, who quit the country in 1931, has been reported toying with the idea of flying back to Spain from Central Europe. The heir presumptive, Prince Juan of the Asturias, is believed to have visited the rebel leaders at Burgos.

Rebel radio broadcasts from Spain, heard at Rabat, French Morocco, today declared the position of the government in Ma-

drid was becoming precarious and that extremists were killing hundreds of persons in the capital. A rebel scouting plane, in a spectacular aerial battle over the French frontier, drove two government bombers back to their bases today with bullets which splattered French soil.

The Spanish bombers were roaring over the fighting front toward rebel positions when the insurgent plane dived out of the clouds to meet them, 5,000 feet above the Bidassoa River, forcing them down to 1,000 feet. They escaped over French territory.

The radio station at Jerez de la Frontera, near Cadix, announced a Madrid personality, now in Tetuan, Spanish Morocco, declares that in two nights the Marxists killed 2,000 persons in Madrid.

Two thousand government militiamen comprised the forces reported only twenty-five miles from Burgos. The swift march on the rebel center followed by one day an important insurgent advance which dominated the Lozoya Valley, some forty miles north of Madrid.

Outside of Spain, Fascist Italy completed her adherence to the international neutrality pact by declaring a formal embargo on arms shipments to either side. The Spanish government has accused Italy of helping the rebels, and says it will continue to do so, along with Germany and Portugal, despite the pact. Officially, however, Germany already has declared an arms embargo and Portugal has taken similar action.

At Washington, the United States State Department acknowledged Madrid's "profound regret" that official mail addressed to the American embassy in the Spanish capital had been opened. It will not happen again, the Spaniards said.

Pope, Ill, Grieves. A sad sidelight of the conflict was its effect on the health of 79-year-old Pope Pius XI. His illness, grieving over the civil war's ferocity, was weakened to the point of exhaustion.

The Spanish ambassador to London, Lopez Olivan, resigned today. He made no comment upon his action.

The Burgos rebels, in today's pronouncement, declared they would collaborate closely with the "friendly" powers of Germany and Italy.

Rebels Accuse France. They formally accused France of "sacking the Bank of Spain" through gold importations from Madrid, and outlined an ambitious program of "cleansing" Spain when—and if—they seize power.

The government tried all available leftist militiamen to block the attempt to capture the Irun mountain stronghold. A day-long bombardment of the slope by rebel planes and field guns prepared the way for the insurgent rush, and government bombers which attempted to blast rebel positions were routed by a single scouting plane over the ranco-Spanish border.

With the big onslaught, refugees again rushed across the international bridge into France with wagonloads of belongings. In Behobie, on the French side of the frontier, a woman bystander struck by a stray bullet yesterday succumbed to her wounds.

SCHACHT, BLUM TALK NEW PACT

PARIS, Friday, Aug. 28.—(AP)—Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, Germany's "economic dictator," conferred with Premier Leon Blum and headed homeward today at the close of a combined political-financial mission in which, informed sources said, he pressed for a Franco-German trade accord as the starting point of a general rapprochement.

The Schacht-Blum conference lasted an hour and, while the principals would not disclose its details, there were rumors in financial circles that the Bank of International Settlements might be made the agent for a vast project of European economic and monetary reform.

Luckenbach Told To Make Up With His Fourth Wife

SAN FRANCISCO, Friday, Aug. 28.—(AP)—One of the Luckenbach marital troubles may be settled today without further aid from the courts.

Lewis Luckenbach, steamship company executive, and his fourth wife were under court order to reach a reconciliation today so Gladys Luckenbach's \$1,000 a month separate maintenance suit could be dropped. Their attorneys did the conferring.

Luckenbach's fourth wife is a defendant in a \$100,000 alienation of affections suit filed by his third wife, Dorothy, and wife No. 2, Della, is suing him for back alimony.

SOVIET WOULD OUTLAW WAR

GENEVA, Friday, Aug. 28.—(AP)—Soviet Russia tonight proposed a bold scheme of League of Nations reform which would force almost immediate military sanctions against any nation making war.

Russia, in making the proposal, opposed amendment of the League covenant as impractical, but recommended adoption by the assembly of a special protocol by which, in the event of war, the League Council would be summoned within three days.

(Controlled Russian newspapers today charged Germany was preparing a surprise move which would bring Europe closer to war.) The League Assembly meets the third week in September, principally to discuss proposals for League reform.

Capt. Cooke, Navy, Dies. BOSTON, Friday, Aug. 28.—(AP)—Capt. Frederick H. Cooke, 57-year-old head of the Public Works Department at the Boston Navy Yard died last night at Chelsea Memorial Hospital. He had been in the Navy since 1904.

Driver Says He Was That Way; Judge Says No

Fred Peabody, 43-year-old painter, was acquitted on a reckless driving charge yesterday by acting Police Judge Jacob Kalina after Peabody pleaded guilty.

Patrolmen E. C. Scully and P. M. Hughes testified they saw Peabody driving in unmarked street car tracks at Rainier Avenue and Othello Street Wednesday night, and said he was intoxicated.

Peabody said he "had had four or five beers and can't stand much beer without feeling it." Police said he appeared confused.

Judge Kalina said he didn't understand the officers actually had seen the man driving, and said when he asked them if Peabody was intoxicated, he understood them to say Peabody "had been drinking but wasn't drunk."

"Even if Peabody pleaded guilty, I'm just interested in simple justice," said Kalina. "That's why I released him."

Arai, Legislature Candidate, Hits 'isms'

Liberty under the Constitution should be zealously guarded, Clarence Arai, candidate for the Republican nomination for state representative from the 37th District, said today in beginning an intensive canvass of his district.

"Foreign 'isms' have no place in our own form of government, either in this state or the nation," he said.

Arai, a practicing attorney, was born in Seattle. He was graduated from the University of Washington Law School in 1924.
