ROAD DISTRICTS MUST CUT COSTS

With the announcement the county road district fund is on a warrant basis due to excessive expenditures, County Auditor Earl Millikin today warned the Board of County Commissioners drastic curtailments must be made.

Millikin said the county's two road districts were overdrawn \$126,362 June 30, after deduction of uncollected-for warrants.

"I'm afraid the fund has been forced to a warrant basis with no relief in sight unless drastic curtailments are effected immediately." The county pays 6 per cent interest on warrants.

The largest overdraw, \$83,244, is for maintenance for the six months ending June 30.

Millikin pointed out King County's share from the state gasoline tax fund was \$88,166 less for the six months than the estimate of State Highway Director Lacey V. Murrow. Millikin said the county's expenditures have not been reduced accordingly.

Escaped Slayer Is Trailed to Sound

 cities guarded highways leading in all directions from Shelton.

Leuch, a powerful man, pounced on jailer Roy Daniels when the officer took his dinner yesterday. The ex-policeman quickly overcame the jailer and took his keys, leaving the deputy locked in a cell.

Matron Forced into Jail

On his way out of the jail, Leuch met and seized Mrs. Olive Tucker, matron, and forced her into the jail.

Bill Hoyle, about to enter the sheriff's office, saw Leuch run out of the jail and head east on the highway toward Olympia. Leuch timed his escape for an hour when almost the whole population was watching the American Legion state junior baseball championship games between Shelton and Yakima at the ball park.

Search for the murderer, convicted two weeks ago after a sensational trial for the shooting of his wife, Lena, 37, on June 1, centered at first in the heavily-wooded area along Hood Canal between Olympia and Shelton.

Leuch had not been sentenced when he escaped. The jury which convicted him of shooting Mrs. Leuch made no recommendation for mercy and death by hanging was mandatory under Washington law.

Leuch Took No Weapons

In his flight from the Mason County jail Leuch did not stop to arm himself from the sheriff's arsenal, Daniels was unarmed when Leuch attacked him. Daniels was not injured. He and Mrs. Tucker were forced to remain in the cells for an hour until duplicate keys were obtained to replace those carried away by Leuch.

State police quickly pointed out that Leuch could obtain weapons from any isolated farmhouse, of which there are many in the timbered back country. Leuch is a reputed dead shot, having also been a former guard at the Minnesota state prison.

Leuch's trial disclosed that he had been carrying on an affair with Miss Betty Irwin, Olympia usherette, formerly of St. Cloud. She testified against him at the trial, naming him as the father of her unborn child. Her testimony largely established the motive for the slaying. Mrs. Leuch was the mother of seven minor children.

Mrs. Leuch's body was discovered in their home June 1. Leuch said he found her dead on his return from an errand, and contended throughout the trial that she shot herself when she learned of his affair with Miss Irwin. State experts, after an examination of powder marks, testified Mrs. Leuch could not have shot herself.

Thurston County officers immediately sought Miss Irwin after the news of Leuch's escape, fearing he might seek vengeance for her testimony at the trial. They placed a guard over her.

Dog Given to Man He Obeys
 CHICAGO, Monday, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Jiggers, a blooded Irish Terrier, was a popular pooch. Nine persons claimed his ownership. Judge Thomas A. Green awarded him to Harry Glickman after it was found in court that Jiggers would perform tricks for Glickman but turned a deaf ear to other claimants.

Japanese Loses Ancient Sword Vital to His Life

J. Imamoto's sword had been in the family since 1200 A. D. Imamoto's ancestors for centuries carried the sword as their mark of Samurai, the gentry in the Japanese feudal days, and occasionally used it on their enemies. The Samurai had power of life and death over the commoners.

Besides all this, the sword, pilfered from its ornate case in the Imamoto home, 4106 Main St., was valued at \$600 on the open market. Imamoto told police today as he reported the theft.

Imamoto said the ancestral silk cloth and braided silk cord in which the sword was wrapped, also were taken.

Injured Man Found By Bloodhounds

Charles A. King, 89 years old, was in critical condition today in Harborview County Hospital after apparently falling down a 100-foot bank a mile from his home near Woodmont Beach.

Missing from his home for fourteen to sixteen hours, King was found yesterday afternoon by Rambler, a sheriff office bloodhound. He was unconscious, suffering from head injuries and exposure. He apparently had wandered down the bank, lying there all night.

I. W. A. Certified For Sound Timber

The National Labor Relations Board today certified the International Woodworkers of America, a C. I. O. affiliate, as the collective-bargaining agency for 208 employes of the Sound Timber Company's camps No. 3 and 5. E. J. Eagen, regional director, announced. The certification was based on a hearing here in June. The timber workers involved are in the Skagit, Snohomish and Whatcom County areas. Eagen said.
