Tatibana was released under \$50,000 bail provided by Japanese Consul Kenji Nakauchi after unsuccessful efforts to have the amount reduced. Kono. unable to post \$25,000 bond, remained in jail. They were arrested yesterday. "We have a good case against the Japanese and the investigation is not yet over," said Palmer.. He said Blake was held in technical cutody, but did not elaborate. The conspiracy charge carries a maximum penalty of ten years' imprisonment and \$10,000 fine.
