BREWERY UNIONS HALF ORIENT, HALF MAY GO ON STRIKE

Scale for Coming Year Rejected by Brewers Association.

Ultimatum to Employes Is Issued, and Trouble May Follow.

Right to Hire and Discharge Union Men Involved in Issue.

UNLESS there is a mutually satisfactory adjustment of existing differences between the brewers of Western Washington and their employes by next Monday, there is every probability that between 1,500 and 2,000 employes of the brewing establishments of the coast will be laid off...

The ultimatum of the brewers' association was agreed to this morning. In effect the brewers say they will not grant the demands in full made by their employes. There has been talk of arbitration, but this has been futile up to date.
