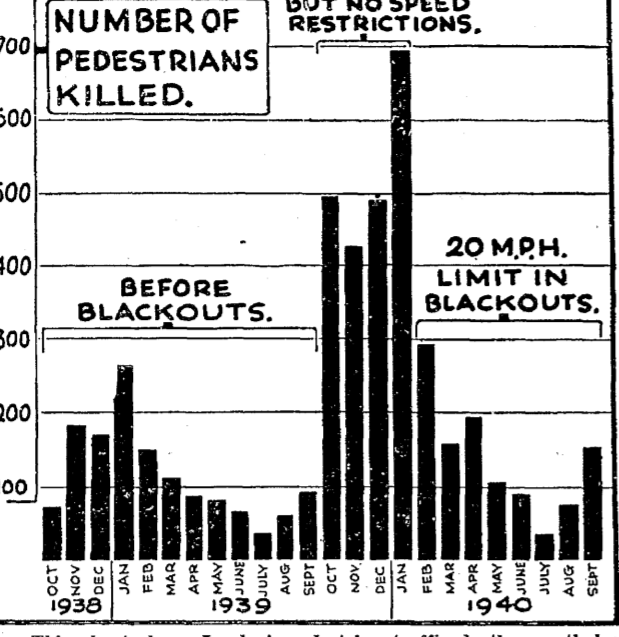

The low months at the left are in the pre-blackout months; the center lines are during the first months of war, up to the fatal January, 1940, when nearly 700 persons were killed in one month. The deaths fell sharply when a 20-mile speed limit was invoked during the blackout, the Seattle Traffic and Safety Council points out.
