

GRANGE PLEDGES SUPPORT IN WAR

Thirty-seven thousand Washington State Grange members yesterday pledged by their state master, Henry F. Carstensen, to give the fullest cooperation to the government in the conduct of the war.

"Come what may," Carstensen said, "we are all Americans and we are in this war together to the finish, and we cannot rest until full victory is won."

"In accordance with the action of the Washington State Grange at its annual convention at Olympia in June, 1940, I have written to President Roosevelt and Gov. Arthur E. Langlie, offering to place our facilities at the disposal of the government in any way required for defense during the war period."

Wilhelmina Pledges F. R. Military Aid

WASHINGTON, Saturday, Dec. 13.—Military cooperation of The Netherlands was pledged in the Pacific war by Queen Wilhelmina in a message to President Roosevelt which was given out by the State Department today. Her message follows:

London, Dec. 8, 1941.
The President:
It is gratifying thought to me, Mr. President, that now that an armed conflict has broken out as a result of Japan's wanton attack against the United States, the Army and Navy and the air force of The Netherlands will fight as comrades in arms and in the same good cause as the military, naval and air forces of the United States. My thoughts are with you and with the American government and people in this hour of our common trial from which, with God's help, we shall arise victorious.

WILHELMINA.
President Roosevelt replied as follows: December 11, 1941.
Her Majesty, Queen Wilhelmina, London.

My most sincere thanks for your message. It is indeed gratifying that the American people will have beside them in the trials ahead your heroic people who have shown such courage and determination. The strength of freedom is a sure bond which, with God's help, cannot fail.

FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT.
Gen. Agustin P. Justo, former president of Argentina, telegraphed President Roosevelt that "the people of my country are firmly by the side of the great democracy of the north and its illustrious president." In reply Mr. Roosevelt said:

I am deeply grateful for your expression of personal support in this emergency and for your personal statement that you believe the people of the Argentine Republic are firmly at the side of the people of the United States in their struggle for the preservation and victory of democracy. I send you my warmest personal regards.

San Francisco Has Six Traffic Deaths

Two cars collided on the San Francisco-Oakland Bay bridge, killing Jasper Johnson, 39 years old, Oakland, and Mrs. Eldon Johnson, 37, San Francisco.

Charles T. Mayher, 54, Redwood City, was killed when his car collided with one driven by Laura Ann Becker, 29, Piedmont.

Arthur M. Lyons, 45, Redwood City, died of injuries suffered in an automobile collision in which his wife, Eva, 40, and James H. Harris, 33, Mountain View, were killed.


