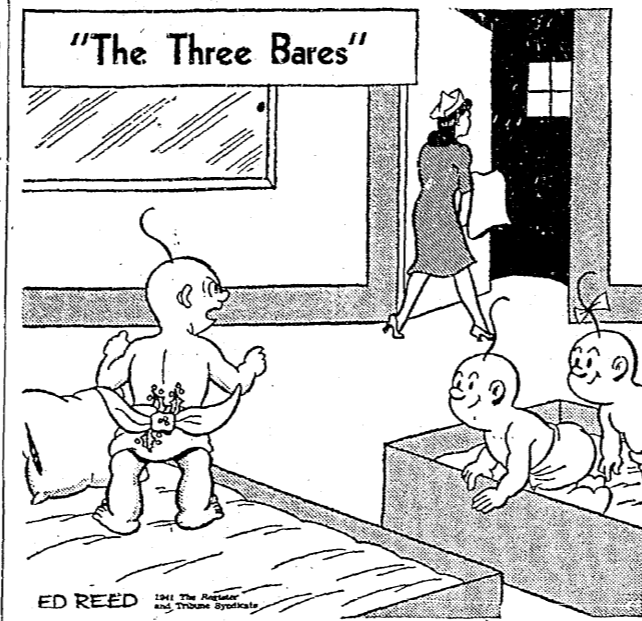
### Yule Blackout Is Problem

FORT SILL, Okla., Thursday, Dec. 18.—The quiet-spoken, slender private over there at the 155 m. m. howitzer is the son of the late Brig. General William (Billy) Mitchell, the man who argued so vociferously that planes could sink battleships.

BOWMANVILLE, Ont., Thursday, Dec. 18.—(AP)—Lieut. Ulrich Steinhilper, 23-year-old Germany flyer who was frustrated in a flight by locomotive from the Bowmanville internment camp November 24, was hunted as a fugitive again today.



Capt. William R. Jarrell, head of the Seattle Secret Service office, today warned that two men and a woman, who have been attempting to collect bogus license fees from Seattle Japanese, still are at large. Jarrell said he has asked police to keep a sharp lookout for the trio. The trio has been visiting Japanese rooming-houses and hotels demanding fees for licenses to operate such establishments. He said aliens may receive licenses only through the Federal Reserve Bank and that no collectors have been sent out by the government for this purpose.

The regulations issued last week after proclamations by President Roosevelt give the federal government powers of summary arrest and detention of any Japanese, Germans and Italians over 14 years old who are deemed to be "dangerous to the public peace or safety of the United States."

Like his famed father, who by the end of the first World War was a brigadier general commanding A. E. F. aviation, John L. Mitchell launched himself upon an Army career the hard way—in the ranks. It is quite possible that Mitchell might have used the influence attached to his father's name (and he also had R. O. T. C. training at Cornell University) to obtain a commission. But he didn't.

In his original bid for liberty he burrowed under the wire. He then secreted himself aboard a Canadian National Railway engine which was switching cars to Niagara Falls, N. Y., but did not realize when the international boundary was crossed. He was captured by the engine's crew after returning to Canadian territory.
