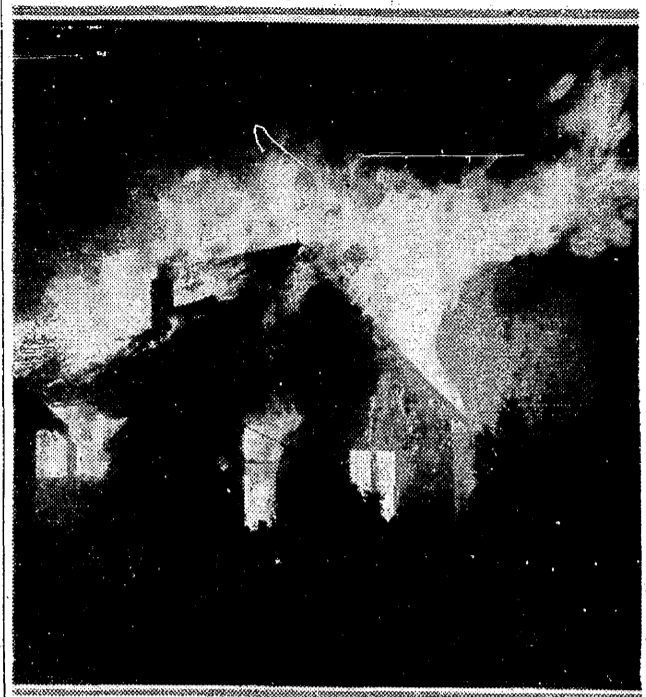
The Consolidated South District Commercial Club will elect officers when it meets tomorrow noon in the 40 & 8 Veterans' Club, 519 Third Ave.
