

Lower California's Japs Moved Inland

ENSENADA, Mex., Friday, Jan. 16.—(AP)—As a wartime precaution, agents of the Mexican government have transplanted nearly all of Lower California's 2,000 Japanese aliens to the interior of the country.

Eighty Japanese are being kept under close watch here, and at nearby Sausal to help operate the fishing fleet.

Officials estimated that the peninsula's evacuees left property worth about \$1,000,000. It will be taken over by the government for the duration of the war.

Army Will Test Biggest Howitzer

MILWAUKEE, Friday, Jan. 16.—(AP)—A 240-millimeter howitzer, one of the largest pieces of mobile artillery ever built in this country, was rolled out of a factory yesterday and started on its way to the Aberdeen, Md., Army proving ground.

The gun, which has a 27-foot barrel, was guarded by soldiers. A convoy of three 10-ton moving trucks, a self-propelling crane and eight other vehicles, accompanied it.

Navy to Take Over Royal Hawaiian

HONOLULU, Friday, Jan. 16.—(AP)—Navy authorities announced yesterday that the Royal Hawaiian Hotel here would be taken over under lease by the Navy, about January 20, for use as a rest and recreation facility for officers and enlisted men of the Pacific Fleet.

They said it was hoped that a portion of the hotel's accommodations for 700 persons may be made available to Army personnel.

German Rail Curb Hints Troop Moves

LONDON, Friday, Jan. 16.—(AP)—The Exchange Telegraph heard a Berlin radio announcement today that further curtailment in rail road-passenger traffic had been ordered, starting Sunday night, because of an "increase in important traffic."

In the past, one of the indicators of impending important German action has been suspension or abbreviation of rail traffic to clear the roads for military purposes.
