Jan. 27.—(P)—The final session of the Pan-American conference, at which the many agreements of the foreign ministers were to have been signed, was postponed today when Ecuador threatened a denunciation of Peru over their border differences and declared herself prepared to leave the conference.

The Ecuador an minister to Rio de Janeiro, Enrique Arroyo Delgado, who is a member of his country's delegation, said: "Ecuador is ready to make a strong denunciation of Peru at the plenary session and leave the conference without signing the final accords."


