In California today, 86 agents, armed with more than 200 presidential warrants for arrest and search, raided Japanese residences in the vicinity of the Sacramento Municipal Airport and the hearby Army base at Mather Field, the Associated Press reported.

## Thousands Live Here

R. P. Bonham in charge of the United States Immigration Office in Seattle, said that in Western Washington there are 5,447 Japanese aliens, 2,254 German aliens nese aliens, 2,254 Gerr and 3,017 Italian aliens.

Of this number, King County has 3,851 Japanese aliens, 1,215 German and 1,853 Italian aliens. Pierce

The government does not plan to intern the aliens. When boundaries of the prohibited area have been a short

intern the aliens. When boundaries of the prohibited area have been announced, the aliens will be given a short period of grace in which to pack their belongings and leave for any place they desire as long as it is outside a prohibited area.

There will be absolutely no exceptions and it will be up to the aliens themselves to provide their own transportation. However, the government will attempt to aid them somewhat.

United States Employment Offices throughout the area will be designated as clearing houses. These offices will attempt to find employment for the aliens in other parts of the country, outside the prohibited area.

Likewise, it will attempt to replace workers in jobs which the aliens will be forced to leave. Queries regarding the removal eshould be directed to these offices.
