MANY NEW BOATS VESSEL COLLIDES GENERAL SHIPWRECKS FOR TRADE WITH WHARF OCEAN RACE

Kosmos Line Starts Big Ship Out From Hamburg for Puget Sound and Has Several Other Large Vessels Building

Steamships Now Being Built to Carry Freight Across Two Oceans Show Increase in Tonnage Over Old Vessels.

Five new steamships building for the Kosmos line will be seen on Puget Sound within a short time. The vessels are to be called the Nikrotis, the Sirocco, the Rhodopis, Sakkarai and the Serok. The Nikrotis will carry 7,500 tons and the Rhodopis and Sirocco are twin screw ships, each carrying 8,300 tons. The Sakkarai and Serok have a registered tonnage of 1,800.

Trade between Hamburg, South and Central America, Mexico, and Puget Sound is increasing to such an extent that the officers of the company in Germany are building new and larger vessels every year to handle the freight offering.

Movements of the company's steamers are reported to the local representative, D. W. Burchard, from day to day. The steamer Nautilus is now at Tacoma and should be in port the latter part of the week.

The steamer Memphis, another of the company's big liners, sailed from Seattle for Honolulu, San Francisco, and Puget Sound by way of San Francisco. The Anolis was at Callao June 28.

The Assuan sailed from London May 3. The steamer Denderah sailed from Hamburg May 20 and from London June 8.
