

Three Japanese, Branded As Dangerous, Held at L. A.

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 28.—(AP)—Three Japanese branded as dangerous in the Dies report on Axis activities were arrested by the Federal Bureau of Investigation here immediately after Pearl Harbor. They are:

Mrs. Takahashi Furuizawa, "long suspected of being a Japanese navy spy," a frequenter of harbor areas and decorated by the Japanese government.

Momota Okura, whose children were described as having "nothing but contempt for any Americans" and who photographed a fort and air field in this area.

F. Mio, reported to have boasted he was "one of the best spies there is" and to have operated a powerful telescope from a room overlooking Los Angeles harbor.

The three still are in custody. The F. B. I. declined further information.
