# FINISHES SEASON

Concluding what has been probably its most spectacular season, the Seattle Symphony under Sir Thomas Beecham's baton presented its final concert to a large crowd at The Music Hall last night.

It was an all-Mozart program. The great majority of concerts this season have been all-Mozart programs. Sir Thomas believes that Mozart is, purely and simply, the greatest of all composers. Sir Thomas not being at all reticent in support of his belief, the orchestra has presented the master's works with unflagging energy and in staggering volume.
