Popo Remained Up Late. Contrary to his usual habits, the Pope remained up late last night for the purpose of personally reading the telegrams and going over certain documents concerning the situation in France. With him at work was Cardinal Merry Del Val, the papal secretary of state, who is proving an indefatigable assistant.

Catholics Are Divided. According to reports received at the Vatican, the Catholics are divided into two columns, those who identify the interests of the church with their own political interests, and those who identify the interests of the church with the interests of the state. The latter are regarded as the more patriotic and good Catholics at the same time.

Vatican Congratulated. On the other hand, the Vatican authorities have received thousands of telegrams of congratulatory messages from bishops, Catholic clubs and prominent Catholics, Italian and foreign, commending the action of the French government.
