'The climax of the "410-B" speak easy slayings, which started a political uproar last August, will begin tomorrow when Edward L. Yager goes on trial in King County Superior Court, charged with firstdegree murder for the shooting of Gus Golmatis, bartender.

Only murder trial in months, the case will enliven a dull winter court calendar as police again go over details of the shooting spree that took three lives and hurt seven other persons in the basement speakeasy at 410-B Second Ave.

The 28-year-old Yager, who was wounded critically by police in a wild pistol battle, has recovered fully and is a quiet, even model prisoner, jailers say. H. Sylvester Garvin of defense

counsel said yesterday Yager will ssert he was so intoxicated at the time of the shooting that he did not know what he was doing. Pleas of not guilty and not guilty by rea-son of mental irresponsibility were entered for Yager shortly after the shooting. Prosecutor B. Gray War-ner and his chief criminal deputy Charles C. Ralls, will contend Yager was responsible for his actions, in support of a premeditation factor that enters into first-degree murder cases.


