Posthumous Writings of Clemens Vonnegut, Sr.; Reveal Unusual Religious Views on Matters Theological.

Ind., Thursday, Dec. 27.—Friends of the late Clemens Vonnegut, Sr., one of the best known dermans in America, who died recently, participated in a memorial meeting in the Socialer Turnverein Hall, of which organization the deceased was one of the founders, and they listened to an unusual statement of Vonnegut's religious views, a statement which he requested read at his funeral.

Vonnegut, then in the prime of life, addressed his words to "friends and fees," Among other things he declared his disbelief in a personal God and in a personal devil, and sald he could not necept the doctrine of punishment in future life.

"Friends and Foes—All you who stand here at my grave and give my body back to the earth, and you, my dearest relatives, do not mourn. I have now reached the end of my career, as you will some time reach the end of yours. I rest now and nothing will ever be able to disturb my rest. I am troubled by no sorrow, grievance or affliction; no wisnes, passion, pain, self-reproach and no reproach for others. I am now perfectly at rost. I departed from this life with a loving sentiment for entire humanity and I herewith remind you; he mindful of the truth that men can sensible and contribute to each other's happines happines had an expense and love of mankind. JAPANESE QUESTION CAN'T BE COMPROMISED

Talking It Over at Washington Will Do No Good.

SAN FRANCISCO, Thursday, Dec. 27.

—The departure for the East of United States District Attorney Robert E. Devilin in response to a summons from Secretary Bonaparte, gives rise to a report that the members of the local board of education are to explain their position on the Japanese question to the authorities in the belief that the meeting of all authorities upon a common ground might lead to a compromise. The position taken by the board does not seem to favor a proposition of the kind. According to President Altmann there is nothing to compromise.

"Debate will scarcely alter conditions or accomplish any change," said President Altmann today, "and a conference at Washington could not modify the law under which the board is acting."

New York Armenian Threatened With Death if He Does Not Pay \$1,000, and Police Protect Him.

NEW YORK, Thursday, Dec. 27.—Announcement was made today that Dr. Markar G, Dadirrian, a well-known Armenian physician anl manufacturer, is guarded by the police as the result of a Black Hand plot. The physician, it is said, has recently received two letters threatening him with death if he fulled to pay \$10,000 to the writers, and the police, to whom the case was reported, decided to guard his residence in Harlem night and day. Dr. Dadirrian is 70 years old and said to be wealthy. He is one of the most influential Armenians in the country. Though frightened by the demands, he says he would rather die than pay the money demanded by the blackmailers.

LAMAR. Colo., Thursday, Dec. 27.—City Marshal Horace Frisby was shot and killed last night by two strangers who subsequently disappeared. There is no clue to the murderers, but it is supposed that they were two men who have been langing around for several days and acting in a suspicious manner.

JAPAN'S NAVY

Increase of \$23,500,000 in Appropriation Is Called for in Estimates Submitted by Mikado's Government.

VICTORIA. B. C. Thursday, Dec. 27.

Advices by the Tosa Maru say the military section of the Japanese government intends to increase the army until the standing forces number nineteen divisions, six more than before the wat. The program also calls for increase in naval estimates by an expenditure of \$23.500,000 more than last year's estimate. It also has been agreed that \$100,000,000 will be appropriated in annual installments as special expenditure for new ships, and the restoration of the present fleet and armaments to an efficient state. An estimate of \$400,000 to defray the expenses of dispatching a squadron, including cruisers Tsukuba and Chitose, to the United States next summer, has been asked for. It is undecided yet whether Admiral Togo will be in command of the squadron. There is some opposition in naval circles to that course, but popular clamor may provail, in which case the naval here will be a feature of a Japanese demonstration in American waters.


